EARLY CLARKS OF WESTFIELD, NEW JERSEY

Two available sources provide information about one of several Clark families who either helped found or settled Westfield, NJ. These sources are (1) "Fighting Clarks of Westfield, NJ," by Macgeorge [no further bibliographic information available] and (2) data prepared by Harman R. Clark, Jr., 229 So. Washington Ave., Dunellen, NJ 18812-1645.

Samuel Clark, who came from Heresford, England, settling in Long Island, is believed to be the first known progenitor of this one Clark family of Westfield, NJ. Samuel and his wife, Hester White, were parents of Thomas Clark. Thomas fathered William Clark, one of the founders of Westfield.

William Clark, born about 1689 and died 10 Oct 1749, married in 1710 a young lady named Sarah Trotter (born 1699 and died 10 Jan 1749). William and Sarah had two sons: William (1711-1758) and Charles.

Charles Clark was born in 1716 and died 14 Feb 1785. Charles, a soldier of the American Revolution, married in 1747 Mary Marsh, who died 10 Dec 1817. Five of Charles and Mary's children listed below lived to adulthood. Their three sons--Azariah, Charles, and William--and their wives were with Charles and Mary on the rolls of Westfield Presbyterian Church in 1785.

(1) Charles Clark was born 21 Sep 1752, died 18 Sep 1821, and is buried in the Colonial Cemetery, Westfield, NJ. Charles, a soldier of the Revolution from Essex Co., NJ, married first Anna Yeomans (born 21 Sep 1751 and died 23 Apr 1787) and married second Elizabeth Fitzrandolph, who became the third wife of Dr. Philemon Elmer in 1825, after Charles's death. Charles Clark was at one time President of the State Senate and in 1812 was Acting Governor. Charles's children by Anna Yeomans were Charles, Jr., born 1782; Benjamin Trotter, b. 1787; Samuel Yeomans, born 1786; and Eliza.

(2) Azariah Clark was born about 1754, died 19 Jun 1825, and is buried in the Colonial Cemetery, Westfield, NJ. He served as a light artillery express rider in Essex Co., NJ, during the Revolution, being a prisoner at Sugar House at the same time his younger brother William was held. Azariah married Elizabeth (surname not known).

(3) William Clark was born 17 Jun 1756, died 28 Sep 1853, and is buried in Colonial Cemetery, Westfield, NJ. He married Sarah (Sally) Hetfield, daughter of Elder Andrew Hetfield and niece of Sarah (Hetfield) Clark, wife of Abraham Clark, the Signer. William Clark was the last survivor of the Sugar House. William and Sarah were parents of two sons who served in the War of 1812. Sarah was a great favorite of her aunt, Sarah (Hetfield) Clark, since she and William helped manage the aunt's affairs after Abraham Clark's death by sunstroke. William and Abraham were cousins through William's great grandmother, Elizabeth (Clark) Marsh, who was a sister of Abraham Clark's grandfather.

In addition to the sons of Charles and Mary (Marsh) Clark, there were daughters as shown by baptismal records: Marylark, born 18 Apr 1762; Sarah Hetfield, born 10 Apr 1763; Charlotte, born 6 May 1764; Phebe Hatfield, b. 6 Nov 1768; and Easter, b. 13 Oct 1777.

V-C FRANKLIN WATKINS CLARK

Franklin Watkins Clark, the son of James Towles and Mary Ann Wiltshire Clark, was born in 1847 and died in 1929. He married Mildred Washington Waugh, daughter of Charles Stewart and Frances Faulconer Waugh, on 26 Dec. 1872. He was called into service in 1864 and served in Co. F, First Virginia Reserves. He returned home to Unionville footsore and weary after the surrender of Lee's Army at Appomattox. While his brother John W. was learning the wheelwright trade, he was learning the blacksmith trade. Franklin and Mildred built their home on the land his parents (James Towles and Mary Ann Wiltshire Clark) had given them. Franklin Watkins was a trustee in the Orange Chapel Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and was active in the building of the Bethlehem Methodist Church at Unionville. Mildred was born in 1850 and died in 1926. She and Franklin had eleven children:

UPDATE ON ILLINOIS STATE LIBRARY SERVICES

Frances S. Haas, 834 Milwood Dr., Salina, KS 67401-5129, has informed us that Illinois State Historical Library, Old State Capitol, Springfield, IL 62701, no longer provides free genealogical research for non-Illinois residents. However, according to the letter she received from Director Janice Petterchak, a "request [obituaries, birth, marriage, etc.] for information about one individual must be accompanied by a \$5.00 check made payable to Illinois State Historical Society." Ms. Petterchak states that if you can provide exact citation of the source of the data (publication, date, page, and column of the newspaper), copies will continue to be provided at \$0.25 each (minimum \$1.00), with copies from books or periodicals (with exact citation) at \$0.20 per copy (minimum \$1.00) plus postage and handling.

Editor's Note: Before you order copies or ask that research be done, it would probably be better to write for a complete list of guidelines.
