Dear Robert:

It has been a long time between letters, I trust that all is well with you, we are quite happy here in Orlando on our lovely little lake.

As usual this is a plea for help, my Jenkins history is progressing nicely but there are still a few missing links. I recently received some very interesting information on the Pennsylvania branch of the family so had to do some revamping.

I am now working on the distaff side of William Oswald Jenkins' family. Beulah Jenkins Lawton has been a wonderful help to me, she recently sent me some data which she had found on the DeSaussure - McPherson family connections, which enabled me to get quite a bit of data, however I still lack data on Alexander McPherson which I am hoping that you may be able to give me. On the attached sheet I am giving you a brief resume of the data I have.

I found quite a bit of information in your Miles History which is a very nice piece of work. I also noted a number of Ladson connections. Do you by any chance have more Ladson data which might give a clue to my Talbird-Ladson connection?

In the S.C.Hist. Mag. Vol. 67, No. 3, July 1966, P.P. 180-181, is the following; "In response to a number of inquiries concerning the availability of S.C. family material printed in this Mag., we list the following: Bible Records - Genealogies and Family Histories." which is very nice, however they fail to give the numbers of the magazines where these records may be found, the same applies to the indexes. Have you ever tried to find data in the indexes? Since you have been such a helpful member of the Historical Society can't you bring this up in your next meeting? I would like very much to see the Glover History as I believe it has the date of death of Adam Hubley and Margaret Glover Jenkins. They were buried in the Grahamville cem. and something destroyed their tomb. It would take quite a lot of time to find what you are looking for. There used to be an Index to these magazines in the Bft. Library but I have heard that someone must have taken it. I understand that a lot of things have disappeared in the library lately. There used to be an article by H.A.M. Smith re the Huguenots of Parrysburg with an attached folder giving the names of the first settlers, some time ago when I was in Beaufort I found the article but the list was gone, do you have any records of that sort?

Please excuse looks of this, I am not what you might call a good typist but it has been months since I have done any work on my typewriter, however it is better than my handwriting.

Rev. John Beck died May 19, 1918 age 62 yrs (He married ANN HUQUENIN)

JANE AMZINDZ. dau. of Rev. John and ANN Beck d Oct. 1817, BORN in the 6th month

John Daniel David Beck died Sep 18, 1826, 21 years and 7 months when he died

ANN BECK died 12th March 1836, age 62 yrs 11 months and 17 days
