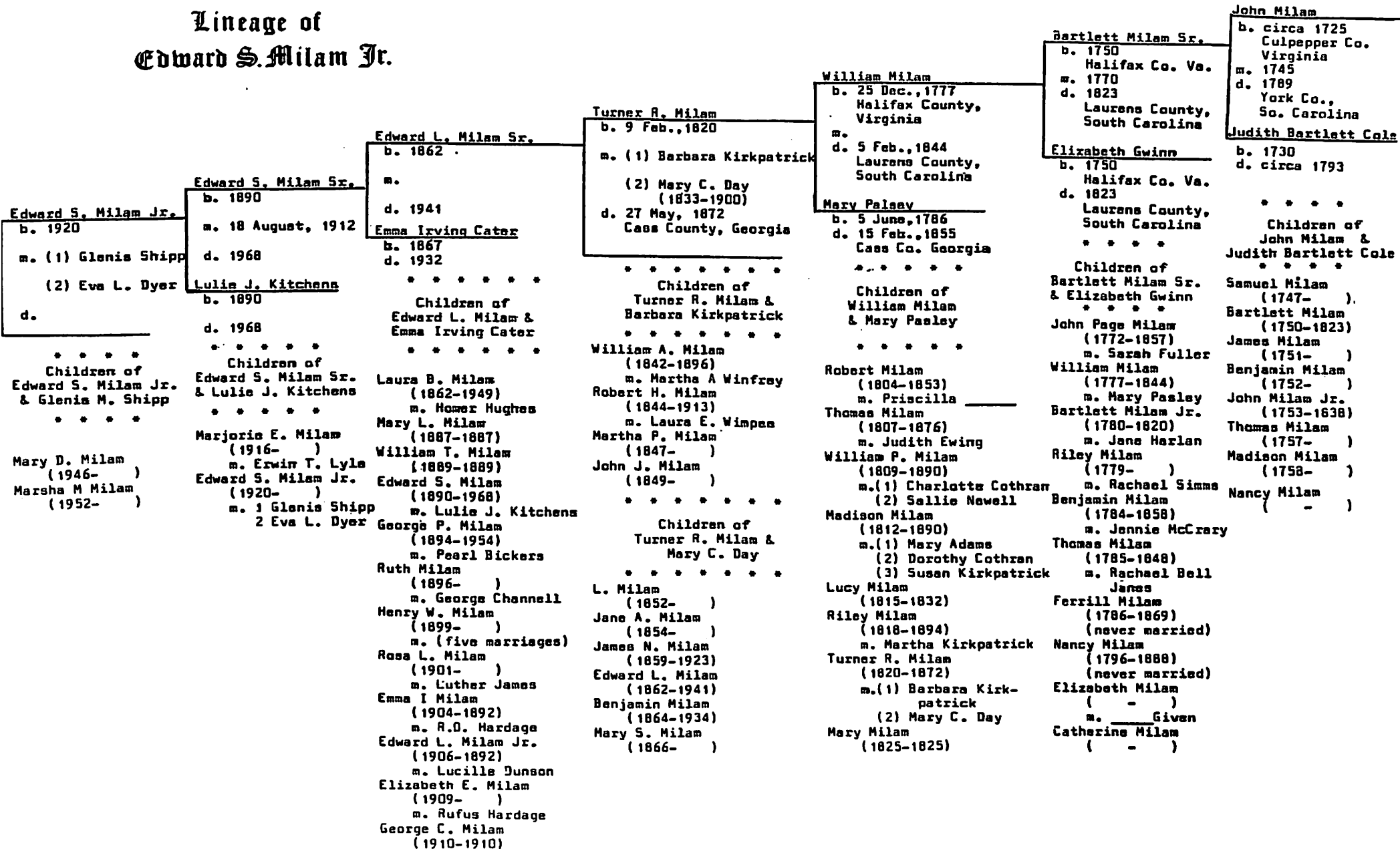

### THREE GENERATIONS

[This column merely provides general information as known by me at the time of writing this. Generally I don't list my sources, documents, or other bits of documentation. That is what the rest of the newsletter is for. I try to be as accurate to the best of my ability, and I may state when it is an opinion or fact. This issued concludes the children, grandchildren and great grandchildren of John and Judith (Bartlett Cole) Milam. Next issue begins the descendants of Thomas and Mary Rush (Adams) Milam.

Let me explain these symbols I use:

- ( ) - parenthesis - are used for maiden names
- [ ] - brackets - are used to state something that is somewhat out of context, kind of a 'by the way' fact
- { } - brackets - are used to indicate something that I question
- / - backslash - is used to indicate an either/or situation, I may have a selection of facts and I don't know which is correct.]

Thomas Milam, son of John and Judith (Bartlett Cole) Milam, was born circa 1757 probably in Brunswick County, Virginia.

Thomas appears on a Tax List for Halifax County, Virginia in 1785. The Tax List shows only three males in Thomas's household and no females. This would indicate that Thomas had two sons by a previous marriage before marrying to Elizabeth Talbert on June 12, 1786 in Halifax County, Virginia. It has been theorized that Thomas' first wife was a Coleman, but nothing has been found to prove this.

Thomas was made Executor of his father's will dated June 3, 1789 York County, South Carolina and recorded August 28, 1789.

In 1790 Thomas appears in the Laurens District, South Carolina census with 1 male, himself, over 16, 2 males under 16 and 3 females, wife and 2 daughters or 1 daughter and his mother, Judith Milam.

On December 16, 1791 Thomas bought from Robert Hall 100 acres located on both sides of North Creek in Laurens District, South Carolina. This transaction appears in Deed Book D, page 161. On August 22, 1793 Thomas bought from Jesse Owley 50 acres on the north side of North Creek in Laurens District, South Carolina. His brothers, Benjamin and John, appear as witnesses in this transaction on Deed Book E, page 40. On October 17, 1797 Thomas sold 50 acres on the north side of North Creek in Laurens District, South Carolina to Jesse Motes. Deed Book G, page 512.

In 1800 Thomas appears in Laurens District, South Carolina with 2 males between 10 and 16, 2 males under 10, 2 females under 10, and his wife.

On December 29, 1800 Thomas sold to John Milam Jr., son of Bartlett, 100 acres located on both sides of North Creek, part of a grant to Cargill, in Laurens District, South Carolina. Bartlett Milam appears as a witness to this on Deed Book G, page 226.

In the 1810 census for Laurens District, South Carolina is



Thomas Milam, with 1 male between 10 and 16, 2 males between 16 and 26, his wife, 2 females between 10 and 16, and 1 female between 16 and 26.

On February 7, 1811 Thomas witnessed a deed of Charles Little to James Leake of 180 acres on Duncan Creek part of which would be sold by Coleman Milam. Deed Book J, page 215. On June 15, 1811 Thomas owned land bordering 200 acres on Duncan Creek which Robert Creswell sold to James Leake. Deed Book J, page 224.

On October 29, 1817 in Laurens District, South Carolina, "John Milam, son of Thomas Milam" was indebted to the firm of Dunlap and Underwood. Judgement was granted December 13, 1817 for \$34.92.

It is believed that in 1819 Thomas moved to Henry County, Georgia. Thomas does not appear in either Laurens District, South Carolina or Henry County, Georgia in the 1820 census. Henry County, Georgia was not formed until 1821. It is possible that he first settled in Wilkes County before going on to Henry County. It is believed that Thomas died somewhere near Stockbridge, Henry County, Georgia in 1823. It is believed he is buried at the Old Concord Cemetery in Stockbridge.

By 1830 Elizabeth Milam appears in Franklin County, Tennessee along with Coleman and John Milam. She has 1 boy between 5 and 10 years of age, 1 boy between 15 and 20, and 1 woman between 30 and 40. Presumably, this could be a daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth and her sons. Elizabeth is between 60 and 70 years of age, indicating she was born between 1760 and 1770.

In April 1854 in Coffee County, Tennessee, a Elizabeth Milam appears on a paupers list to receive \$25.00. Carney Partin was to draw money for said pauper. Can this be Thomas' wife? She would be old, and she is not found on the 1840 and 1850 census.

Census records seem to indicate that Thomas had 6 boys and 6 girls.

Issue of Thomas Milam by first wife:

I. Coleman Milam

[Some believe he is by Thomas' first wife, if he indeed was married previously to Elizabeth Talbert.]

Coleman Milam, believed to be the son of Thomas Milam, was born either in 1781 to Thomas and his first wife or 1787 to Thomas and Elizabeth Talbert. He was born in Halifax County, Virginia.

In the 1800 census Thomas has two males between 10 and 16, which would place them as born between 1784 and 1790, and 2 males under 10, which would place them as born between 1790 and 1800. If Coleman was born in 1781, he would be 19 by 1800, which would either place him under Thomas between 16 and 26 years of age or in his own household. He does not appear in either place. Therefore I believe he was born in 1787 making him a son of Elizabeth Talbert. This date comes from the 1850 census and his

bounty land application.

He married first to a daughter of James Leake circa 1808 in Laurens District, South Carolina. He was either 21 or 27. As it was more common to marry young, I feel 27 is too old. Again, I believe Coleman was born in 1787.

Coleman was conscripted into the service in 1814 in South Carolina during the War of 1812. He would have been either 27 or 35. Again, 35 was uncommonly old to be conscripted into the service. 27 would make him born in 1787.

In 1830 Coleman appears in Franklin County, Tennessee along with his brother John and mother Elizabeth.

Coleman Mileham appears in the 1841 tax list for District 13, Coffee County, Tennessee along with his son Thomas F. Mileham and brother John Mileham.

Coleman married second to Jane Harris in 1842 in Tennessee. She was born in 1817 in Tennessee to John and Sarah Harris.

In 1850 Coleman applied for bounty land. He gave his age as 63. In 1850 and 1860 he was living in Hardin County, Tennessee. Coleman died circa 1869 in Hardin County, Tennessee.

John Milam, son of Thomas and Elizabeth (Talbert) Milam, was

born circa 1795 in Virginia or Laurens District, South Carolina. He married Mary Burrell in January of 1813 in Laurens District, South Carolina. She was born in 1796 in South Carolina.

On November 6, 1814 John enlisted for six months service in Capt. James Word's Company, 3rd, Lt. Col. John A. Alston's, Regiment, South Carolina Militia as a private during the War of 1812. The war having ended John was discharged on March 16, 1815.

On October 29, 1817 in Laurens District, South Carolina, "John Milam, son of Thomas Milam" was indebted to the firm of Dunlap and Underwood. Judgement was granted December 13, 1817 for \$34.92.

John Milam appears in Franklin County, Tennessee in 1830 along with his brother Coleman and mother Elizabeth. In his household he has 1 boy between 5 and 10 years of age, 3 girls under 5, 1 girl between 10 and 15, and his wife.

John Mileham appears in the 1841 tax list for District 13, Coffee County, Tennessee.

They lived in Giles County, Tennessee by 1850 and in Searcy County, Arkansas by 1860.

John died in Searcy County, Arkansas on January 4, 1871.

Mary applied for a widows pension on July 4, 1871 near Marshall, Searcy County, Arkansas.

The following are the only issue I know. These were probably just the youngest that were still living with John in Tennessee in 1850. Because of the early census records, I am sure John had some additional children older than these and including some sons.

Thomas "Tom" F. Milam, believed to be a son of Thomas and Elizabeth (Talbert) Milam, was born circa 1797 in Laurens District, South Carolina.

Thomas F. Milam enlisted on November 6, 1814 in Capt. James Word's Company, 3rd, Lt. Col. John A. Alton's, Regiment of Infantry, South Carolina Militia as a private for a period of six months during the War of 1812.

By 1820 he settled in Georgia. He first appears in 1830 in Newton County. By 1840 he was in Henry County where it is known that he settled near Stockbridge.

Thomas married Drucilla -?- circa 1821 in Georgia. Drucilla was born circa 1805 in Georgia or South Carolina.

On October 2, 1854 Thomas F. Milam Sr. was appointed administrator of the estate of Thomas F. Milam Jr.

In 1860 Thomas and his family were living near Flat Rock in Barnes District, Dekalb County, Georgia.

It is believed that Thomas and his wife Drucilla are buried together about 2 miles south of Stockbridge in Old Concord Cemetery.

Madison Milam, son of John and Judith (Bartlett Cole) Milam, was born circa 1758 probably in Brunswick County, Virginia. I have absolutely no records pertaining to Madison Milam. Ferril Milam and his sister Nancy, children of Bartlett and Elizabeth (Gwinn) Milam, supposedly kept family records and Madison was included as a son of John and Judith. It is also believed that he married Nancy -?-.

Nancy Milam, daughter of John and Judith (Bartlett Cole) Milam, is mentioned in the will of John Milam. This also was another name submitted by Ferril and Nancy Milam. Nancy was accepted as a daughter before discovery of John's will. Thus, perhaps there may be good reason in accepting Madison as a son of John Milam.

#### MILAM GENEALOGIST

During the early part of this century, up to the 1940's, there were several Milam genealogists who really paved the way for us. One such person was Mr. Herbert M. Milam of Atlanta, Georgia. Mr. Milam was born on January 24, 1862 in Cartersville, in then Cass, now Bartow, County, in Georgia. His father, James C. Milam was at that time in Northern Virginia fighting in the Civil War. His mother was Lydia Pauline Wilson. Herbert moved to Atlanta in 1885 and lived there all his life. There he married Nena Mitchell on December 22, 1909. I have many copies of letters, records and miscellaneous data that was compiled by Mr. Milam. He was very active during the 1930's. In HISTORY OF BARTOW COUNTY, GEORGIA by Lucy J. Cunyus, published in 1933, was a compilation of the five Milam brothers, sons of William and Mary (Paslay) Milam of Laurens District, South Carolina, who settled in Cass County, Georgia circa 1851. This sketch was written by Herbert Milam and was instrumental in sparking my more than usual interest in the Milam family.

## MILITARY MILAM

### TANDY WALKER MILAM

Tandy Walker Milam, son of Bartlett and Elizabeth R. (Bell) Milam, was born on September 10, 1833 in Laurens District, South Carolina or in Talladega County, Alabama.

Bartlett was the son of John (Page) and Sarah Ann (Fuller) Milam. He married Elizabeth R. Bell circa 1822 in Laurens District, South Carolina. Elizabeth was the daughter of James and Sarah Bell. Bartlett took his wife to Alabama circa 1825 to 1835, however this is purely a guess. It is hard to say when he did settle in Talladega County, Alabama where he is found in 1850. When Elizabeth died in 1855 Bartlett went to Georgia, but his children went to Winn Parish, Louisiana.

Tandy settled near Terryville, Winn Parish, Louisiana in 1856 along with his brothers and sisters and their families. Tandy was as yet unmarried.

When the War broke out in 1861 Tandy enlisted as a private for twelve months service on July 7 at Camp Moore, Louisiana in Capt. J. R. Kavanaugh's Company, Company K, the 9th Regiment Louisiana Volunteer Infantry. The Regiment was commanded by Col. Richard Taylor, the son of Pres. Zachary Taylor. Richard would eventually become a Lieutenant General.

The regiment was immediately sent to Virginia but just missed participating in the Battle of First Manassas by one day.

On October 9, 1861 Tandy was admitted to General Hospital # 18 in Richmond, Virginia. He had Typhoid. He was transferred on October 17 to General Hospital in Petersburg, Virginia. He returned to duty on November 26, 1861.

On February 12, 1862 Tandy was asked to reenlist for the period of the war, which he did at Camp Carondelet, Virginia. In conformity with an act of the Confederate Congress, Tandy was given a furlough as his bounty for reenlistment. He was on furlough from February 14 to April 14, 1862 and it is presumed he went home to Louisiana.

Most of Company K were captured at Huntsville, Alabama on April 12, 1862 while returning from furlough. Tandy was not with these men and so he was not captured. When he returned to his unit in Virginia he was reassigned to Company F of the 9th Regiment Louisiana Infantry. He was on detached duty as a teamster for the Division's Quartermaster Department throughout the rest of the war.

On September 19, 1862 Tandy was detailed as an Ambulance driver to take the body of Brig. Gen. William E. Starke, who was killed at Sharpsburg on the 17th, to Staunton, Virginia from where he would be taken to Richmond to be buried. He arrived at Staunton on the 22nd and after handing over the Wagon, Tandy returned to join his regiment via the stage.

On February 6, 1865 Tandy was with his regiment when it was captured at Hatcher's Run. Tandy was paroled, along with the rest of the Confederate Army, on April 10, 1865 at Appomattox Court House.

After the war Tandy returned home to Louisiana where he married Martha "Mattie" Ann Madden on May 22, 1867. Martha was born in 1850 in Louisiana. They lived in Lincoln Parish, Louisiana. Martha died in 1914 in Simsboro, Lincoln Parish, Louisiana.

**SOLOMON MILAM**  
**March 14, 1775- September 5, 1853**  
**Bedford Co., Virginia--Macon Co. Missouri**

At age 29, Solomon Milam wanted to marry Nancy Harmon age 16. Nancy's father was a well known resident of Tazewell County Virginia. Mr. Harmon was born in Pennsylvania in 1729, moved to Virginia in about 1736. He had survived several Indian attacks (See Frontier Defense of the Upper Ohio Valley, Thwaites) and had considerable wealth in land and slaves and other property. He was about 75 years old when his next to youngest daughter wanted to marry.

Solomon had to comply with the marriage laws of Virginia in 1804 when he wished to marry Nancy Harmon. The law at that time and up until about 1852 the betrothed couple not only had to obtain a licence from the Clerk of the County, but prospective husbands were required to execute a bond with security, before obtaining a marriage license.

So in 1804, the following transaction took place....

"Sir

You please to grant to Solomon Milam License to marry my daughter Nancy Harmon and in so doing you will oblige your friend To Mr. Joseph Moore-----  
Daniel Harman  
Dpt. Clerk under John Ward of Tazewell County  
November 29th 1804.

Sworn to before me this 29th of November 1804  
J. MOORE

ADAM HARMAN  
HENRY HARMAN."

"Know all men by these presents that we Solomon Milam and Adam Harman are held and firmly bound unto John Page Esqr. Governor of Virginia and his successors in the sum of one hundred & fifty Dollars payment whereof well and truly to be made to the said Governor and his successors we bind ourselves and Heirs & c Jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our Seals and dated the 29th day of November 1804.

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above Solomon Milam hath this day obtained License for his marriage with Nancy Harman, if therefore there is no legal cause to prevent the marriage for which the said license was given, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain and be in force.

So began the married life of Solomon and Nancy. Soloman had been born 14 March 1773 in Bedford County, Virginia. Nancy was the daughter of Daniel Harmon and Anna Bughsen, she was born about 1788 in Tazewell County Virginia. She gave birth to 9 children.

Nancy Harmon died on 8 JUNE 1821. Soloman had all of the children, ages 15 to 1 year to care for alone. His oldest married about a year after her mother's death. I can only guess that she had to help with the raising of the children. Soloman re-married on 9 JUNE 1816 to Nancy Everett. The never had children but she raised the ones that came with the marriage. The family moved to Missouri.
