

5. Charles Richardson Miles, born 3 Aug. 1829 St. Matthew's Parish, Beaufort County, died 23 Dec. 1893; graduated First Honor from the College of Charleston 1849, later served as President of its Board of Trustees; a prominent lawyer, he was Confederate States District Attorney 1862 and during Reconstruction Days worked endlessly "to improve and secure good government for his city and State". In 1878 he was elected to the S.C. House of Representatives and in 1882 Attorney General of S.C., being re-elected in 1886. He married <sup>in 1858</sup> Mary Woodbury Majjick, born 6 June 1833, died 9 July 1873, daug. of William Majjick. Issue:

- a. Annie Charlotte Miles, born April 1859, died Charleston 23 July 1933, married 11 Dec. 1888 Francis Stuart Hanckel. Issue: Charlotte Miles Hanckel, born 16 Sept. 1889, unmarried; Richardson Miles Hanckel, born 2 Oct. 1892, died Oct. 1918 in Gibraltar; Francis Stuart Hanckel, Jr., born 4 July 1897, died 18 Apr. 1960, married (1) 21 Apr. 1921 Pauline Brock Narell, issue and (2) 24 June 1953 Georgette Pepper Pinckney, no issue.
- b. Sarah Arabella Miles, born 17 Jan. 1864, died unmarried 15 July 1935, buried St. John's-in-the-Wilderness, Flat Rock, N.C.
- c. William Porcher Miles, died unmarried in Seattle, Wash.
- d. Mary Miles, died young.
- e. Charles Richardson Miles, Jr., died young.

b. Francis Turquand Miles, M.D., Capt., Charleston Bn., C.A.A., <sup>127</sup> Professor of Anatomy at the University of Maryland, married Jeanie Wardlaw; issue: at least one son:  
Louis Wardlaw Miles, born 1873, Headmaster of the Gilman School, later Prof. of English, Johns Hopkins Univ.; awarded Congressional Medal of Honor for valor on the battlefield in W.W. I in action which resulted in the amputation of one leg and the loss of the use of one arm; he married Katherine Stockton; issue: 4 ch.:

- b. Francis Turquand Miles, M. D.; Capt., Charleston F.A., C.S.A., taught in the Medical College in Charleston, moved to Baltimore after the War and was Professor of Anatomy at the University of Maryland, later becoming a practising neurologist. He married Jeanie Wardlaw; issue:
- a. Francis Turquand Miles, died of diphtheria aged five.
- b. Louis Wardlaw Miles, ~~III~~, born in Baltimore 23 March 1873, graduated from Johns Hopkins 1894, <sup>M.D. degree from</sup> the Medical School of the University of Maryland 1897 and Ph. D. in English from Johns Hopkins; after teaching German at the Gilman School for one year he taught at Princeton University for twelve years prior to WW I. He was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for valor on the battlefield in action which resulted in the amputation of one leg and the loss of the use of one arm; he died in 1944. In 1908 he married Katharine Stockton; issue:

  - (3) Samuel Stockton Miles, born 12 Nov. 1913, <sup>B.S.</sup> ~~graduated~~ from Princeton <sup>and</sup> M.D. from Johns Hopkins; served as Navy doctor attached to U.S. Marines and was killed on Tulagi 7 Aug. 1942, being awarded the Silver Star posthumously. He married 1941 Mary Wick; no issue.
  - (4) Jeanie Wardlaw Miles, born 18 April 1918, married 1942 William Henry Walton II, Princeton, N. J. architect; four children: Adelaide Miller, born 1943, married 1964 Richard Kendall Walton; Katharine Miles, born 1944; William Henry III, born 1947 and Samuel Miles, born 1950.
- c. Sarah Warley Miles, died of a tubercular hip, aged 13.
- d. Alice Patterson Miles, died aged six.
