

5. CHARLES RICHARDSON MILES b. Aug. 3, 1829, St. Matthews Parish, Orangeburg County; died Dec. 23, 1893. Married Mary Woodbury Mazyck (b. June 6, 1833, d. July 9, 1873).

First honor graduate of the College of Charleston, 1849, later served as President of Board of Trustees; prominent lawyer; District Attorney, Confederate States in 1862; great help to city and state during Reconstruction Days - worked endlessly to "improve and secure good government for his city and state". In 1878, served member of House of Representatives; four years later elected Attorney General of South Carolina, re-elected for second term.
