"My Father, Alexander Fraser, was the only son of John Fraser (John
Frasser) who was born at Wigton County Galloway Scotland, and came
to Carolina about 1700. (He is mentioned in Hewitt's history of South
Carolina as a Trader with the Yemassee Indians in 1715, and lived
near Coosawhatchie.)

John Fraser married Judith Warner of Rhode Island, and had four
children. He died in Charleston, S. C. 14 January 1754. His widow
died in April 1772. Their children were:

Alexander, above named born 1722 died 6 May 1791.

Judith, died unmarried 1 May 1763.

Susan, who married Charles Lorimer a Scotch Minister and died in
England - at Shooter's Hill, Kent, 16 June 1785.

Ann, who married William Cattell, 31 July 1746 and had two sons:
Benjamin and William. William left no issue and Benjamin married
a Maryland woman, and has descendants in that State, and one also
residing in South Carolina, Col. William Cattell. Ann married a
second time Col. Owen Roberts, of ^{the 4th S.C. Continentals} the Continental Army, and he was
killed in a battle at Stone Ferry, S.C. 20 June 1779. Ann died in 1804.

Alexander Fraser was married twice, first to Ann Harvey, 10 Nov. 1749,
by whom he had one son, John born 25 Sept. 1750 and died without
issue in 1786. His second wife was Mary Grimké daughter of Frederick
and Martha Grimké, whom he married on ^{Thurs.} 20 March 1755. ^(See gazette 27 Mar. 1755)

"Of my maternal Grandfather Grimké I have but little information. He
was born in Germany and emigrated to this country in 1733, at the
age of twenty eight years. I have the following memorandum in his
handwriting, found in my Mother's pocketbook: "F.G. was born 12/23
October 1705, and married Martha Emms ^{widow} Williamson ^{Mother of Wm. Williamson of 1775} on 22 May 1737. A ^{Comment of Safety}
daughter was born on Tuesday morning between the hours of 6 & 7,

12 September 1738, named Mary, christened 13 October 1738. Another daughter was born about 2 o'clock Sunday morning 29 November

Branston, widow. A large handsome oil portrait of Susan Alison Braly as a child hangs in the home of the Elias Scott Miles family in Summerville. WILLIAM MILES (~~20~~¹⁴, ~~20~~, 3, 1), planter of St. Andrew's Parish, ^{member of the S.C. House of Representatives 1792} born ¹⁷⁶² ~~1773~~, died 1807, married Monday, 4 Nov. 1799 by Rt. Rev. Robert Smith, Bishop of South Carolina, to Mary Anne Blake Rose, daughter of Mary ("Polly") Blake and Thomas Rose. ¹⁸⁵ ¹⁸⁹ Mary ("Polly") Blake was the daughter of Edward Blake, first Commissioner of the Board of Naval Commissioners. ¹²⁴ ¹⁹⁰ Captain William Miles appears in the 1790 Census owning 22 slaves; he was a member of the S. C. House of Representatives in 1792. His will of 28 Dec. 1806, proved 6 March 1807, names "Aunt Fuller", his wife Mary Anne Blake Miles, daughters Polly Blake, ^(named for Mary's mother) Elizabeth Mellichamp, ^(named for William's mother) and Ann Blake Miles. ¹²⁵ ¹⁹¹

Felix Warley and Anne Turquand ^{b. 2 June 1747} and Anne Turquand ^{b. 3 Sept. 1761} who were married ^{16 Dec.} 30 March 1784. James S. Miles was elected a vest-

ryman of St. Bartholomew's Parish at Edmundsbury Chapel 19 April 1824. ¹²⁶¹⁹⁵ He bought pew No. 17 in Walterborough Chapel of St. Bartholomew's Parish 20 July 1826. ¹²⁷¹⁹⁶ The six children of James Saynders and Sarah Bond Warley Miles were:

College, was graduated from General Theological Seminary where he originated the movement which led to the founding of Nashota House Seminary. He was ordained to the ministry of the Episcopal Church 23 July 1841, served St. David's Church, Cheraw 1842-43 where a stained glass window memorializes him. He organized and participated in a mission to Mesopotamia 1843-44 and to Constantinople 1845-47. His biography, "The Rev. James Warley Miles", by George W. Williams, published by Dalcho Historical Society 1953, says he "understood 30 to 40 languages". He was Professor of Greek Literature at the College of Charleston 1850-54, toured Europe 1854-56, was College Librarian 1856-63, Professor of Ancient Languages 1865-71; he died unmarried 14 Sept. 1785. ^{1875.}

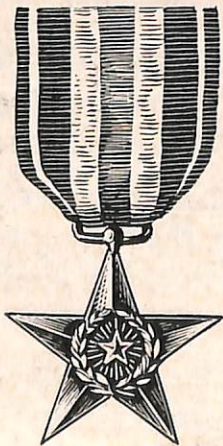

WILLIAM PORCHER MILES (26, 23, 18, 7, 2, 1), born at Walterboro 4 July 1822, died at Houmas House plantation, La. 11 May 1899; he spent a year at Willington Academy then graduated First Honor from the College of Charleston 1842 and was a member of its faculty 1843-1855. In the summer of 1855 he volunteered to go to Norfolk, Va. to nurse victims of a yellow fever epidemic and was

presented a medal by the City of Norfolk for his services. On his return to Charleston he was nominated and elected Mayor of Charleston; in 1858 he was elected to Congress and in 1860 re-elected. He signed the Ordinance of Secession in 1860 and resigned from Congress to represent Charleston in the Confederate Congress. In 1863 he married Elizabeth (Betty) Beirne, born 31 Dec. 1835, died 22 Oct. 1874, daughter of Oliver Beirne, wealthy planter of Walnut Grove plantation, Union, Monroe County, West Virginia and Louisiana, and Margaret Melinda Caperton Beirne. Andrew Beirne, father of Oliver Beirne, had befriended an English immigrant boy, John Burnside, who when he died in 1881 at White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia, was said by the News & Courier to have been "the richest man in Louisiana". The bachelor merchant-planter's will left his entire estate, some of which had once been owned by Gen. Wade Hampton of S. C., to Oliver Beirne.

Following the reorganization in 1880 of the University of S. C., William Porcher Miles served as its first President, resigning in 1882 to manage his father-in-law's 18,200 acres of sugar plantations in Ascension Parish, Louisiana. Residing at elegant Houmas House where he entertained lavishly, he was thereafter known as "the sugar prince". Biographies of William Porcher Miles and his four famous brothers appear in the Cyclopaedia of Eminent & Representative Men of the Carolinas. A manuscript biography through the year 1860 by Sidney Betts Paine is in the South Caroliniana Library in Columbia. Some 3,263 of his papers, including a diary begun in 1870, are in the Southern Historical Collection of the University of N. C.
