"Died on the 17th February, at his usual residence on Black Swamp, Beaufort district, of a lingering illness, which he bore with uncommon patience and Christian resignation, in the 67th year of his age, Dr. George Mosse. He was a native of Ireland, but he has been a respectable and useful citizen. To his adopted country, he was a firm, constant friend; but his philanthropy embraced all mankind. A pious widow, seven daughters, and many friends, lament the loss of this good man."
