

## Ky. Environmentalists Plan 'Dream House'

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — An environmental group wants to convert an old brick building in downtown Louisville into a "dream house" of the future.

It would be heated by the sun, fitted with a disposal system that will turn toilet waste into fertilizer and equipped with a greenhouse and organic garden for growing vegetables.

But that's not all. Plans also call for a windmill that will turn urban breezes into energy. Waste water from the kitchen and bathroom sinks will be filtered and used in the garden.

Ron Gascoyne of the Louisville Community Design Center said the entire project will cost about \$150,000.

The "urban alternative house," as it's being called, was the brainstorm of Strategies for Environmental Control, one of the city's most active environmental and conservation groups.

"We decided we had been reacting, rather than acting, as far as environmental events were concerned, and we felt that everything was very negative," said Patricia Nightingale, 44, president of Strate-

gies. "We found we had been in the position of opposing things, instead of taking affirmative action."

She said it's not really a house of the future because solar energy is available, so is wind-generated electricity, and everyone should grow their own vegetables, she said.

"This is going to be an educational facility. People won't live in the house. We will conduct classes, workshops, and tell people how to solarize their homes," she said.

The project was inspired, though not motivated, by President Carter's energy proposals, said Ms. Nightingale. "We were delighted by Carter's energy message, his leadership, but we'd already planned this. It merely reinforced our feeling and his speech was nice publicity for us."

Ms. Nightingale said money for the project will come from civic and environmental groups. The house being used has been leased to the environmental group for 20 years at \$1 a year.

The solar systems, Gascoyne said, will cost about \$11,000. The design calls for some of the best equipment available, he said, to show the most that can be done. A homeowner's system could be cheaper.

Note. The copy of the will of James Nunn should be on file with these papers in the land office, but it has been misplaced by some "investigator", or mislaid, outside of the land office. Below is an order of probate.

King and Queen Co. court, 9 Jan., 1786. The last will and Testament of James Nunn was offered to proof by Moses Nunn the Extr. therein named, and was proved by the oaths of Thomas Nunn and Joshua Crane, the witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of the said Extr. a certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will. His securities obtained and bond given. Teste, Robert Pollard, Clerk.

#### Hugh Norrell, Private.

Council Chamber, Mar. 28, 1812. Hugh Norrell is entitled to the proportion of land allowed a Private of the Contl. line for three years service. J. S. Barbour, Gov.

Rec'd. June 16, 1814, a land bounty warrant No. 6154 for 100 acres issued to Christopher Degraffenried, assec. Signed, John Hobson, Atty. in fact. Teste, Isaac Davis.

Note. Filed with the assignment of Hugh Norrell, are papers of the same act by a number of soldiers, all of them stating that "for value received", they assigned their bounty claim to DeGraffenried.

Union District, South Carolina, "I, Christopher DeGraffenried appoint John Hobson, my true and lawful Atty." Signed, 30 Mar., 1813.

Hugh Norrell made assignment 28 Sept., 1810.

William Davenport as Sergeant made assignment, 29 Oct., 1810. Ackn. before James Anderson, J. of P. Lieutenant Thomas Wells executed the same, 27 Apl., 1810.

Note. On the reverse side of this paper was written (but crossed out):—"Lieut. in Col. Hobson's company, commanded by James Morton, Capt. 4th Va. Regt. Commanded by Col.

Lawson and Col. Neale, Lieut. Col., and General Scot and Brig. Gen. Stephens, Commander of the Division".

James Gassaway, desired the Register to issue warrant in the name of Matthew and John Hobson, the warrant due for Gassaway's service. Signed, 4 Nov., 1813.

James Alverson made DeGraffenried his assec, 4 Feb., 1812.

Note. There is one other assignment of a soldier, but the name cannot be deciphered, it appears to be Benjamin Stuts.

Governor Henry Middleton of S. C. certified as to the several Justices who acknowledged the above assignments. They were:—W. Rice and W. Johnson, justices for Union District; S. Curry, of Fairfield District; W. B. Farr of Union Dist.; James Anderson of Chester Dist. and Samuel Perrin of Abbeville Dist. Signed by the governor,

These papers are contained in an envelope on which is written:—Warrant 6154 issued to Christopher Degraffenried, Assec of Hugh Norrell, for 100 acres. It is evident that the other warrants were misplaced, or not issued. Recorded Book 3, p 25, Va. L. Off.

#### Matthew Nightingale, Boatswain.

Executive Dept. Dec. 1, 1837. The Governor considered a claim of the heirs of Matthew Nightingale, a Boatswain in the State navy and made the following order thereupon:— In this case the Executive, heretofore allowed Bounty Land to Matthew Nightingale as a Boatswain, for the three years service, and the Register issued his warrant for 200 acres only. This was evidently erroneous—the Boatswain being a Warrant Officer and entitled to the lowest quantity of land allowed to officers.

The Executive does not however feel itself authorized to correct the error of a former Register, and declined entering any other order on the case—than directing this opinion to be communicated respectfully to the Register. A copy, William Richardson, Sect. of the Commonwealth.

James Nightingale as only heir to Matthew Nightingale—appointed William Brent of Washington, D. C. as his Atty. to obtain warrant for the services of his "late Father", Matthew Nightingale, a Boatswain in the Va. state navy. 12 Dec., 1837. Witness, C. H. W. Wharton. Ackn. before C. H. W.

Wharton, J. of P. Dist. of Columbia, 12 Dec., 1837. Attest, William Cranch, Chief Justice of Circuit Court.

A letter to William Selden, Register of land office, from William Brent, Washington, D. C. 8 Jan., 1837.

"Please send me a certified copy of the evidence and papers in the case of Capt. John Thomas(?) of your state navy. It appears that he served during the Revolution, and to the close of it, and if so, they are entitled to receive pay under the laws of Va. and the U. S. It is to enable them to establish their claim that I wish the papers.

I have now sent you all that was required in Nightingale's case to obtain the warrant. How happens it that script cannot be obtained now for such warrants. It is an injustice done to the present claimants, whose rights have so long been delayed. If nothing can be had for the warrants, they are scarcely worth the trouble of obtaining them.

It appears to me, that your Executive or Legislature ought to represent the matter to Congress in some shape. Are not the heirs of Matthew Nightingale entitled to pay? His son tells me he has never received the pay allowed.

Is it so?" Signed.

Letter from William Brent to the Register of land office. Dec. 18, 1838. "Enclosed is evidence of heirship in Matthew Nightingale's case, and the power of Atty. I have written to the clerk of Northumberland Co. where Nightingale lived and died, for certificate relative to the last will and testament, which I will forward." Signed.

Another letter from same. "The receipt of land warrant 8482 issued to James Nightingale for the services for three years of Matthew Nightingale as a Boatswain in Va. State Navy is acknowledged". Signed, William Brent.

Northumberland Co., Va. M. B. Cralle, clerk of the court certified that it does not appear from the records of this office that there is any will of Matthew Nightingale, dec'd. of record. Signed, M. B. Cralle, Dec. 26, 1837.

Washington Co., D. C. At a court held before the Hon. Samuel Chase, Judge of the Orphan's court of said county; evidence was produced proving that James Nightingale, now a resident of Alexandria, in the Dist. of Col. is the only surviving child and the only heir at law in fee of Matthew

Nightingale, who was a Boatswain in the Va. state navy in the Rev. war. and who died about the year 1794 or 1795, in Northumberland Co., Va. Teste, copy from records, Edward N. Roach, Clerk. 12 Dec., 1837.

Warrant 8482 was issued 11 Jan., 1838 for 2466-2/3 acres to James Nightingale, heir at law of Matthew Nightingale. Recorded Book 3, page 435, Va. L. Off.

#### Robert Nicholson, Surgeon.

Exec. Dept. Mar. 27, 1834. The heirs of Robert Nicholson are allowed land bounty for his services as a Surgeon in the State line for three years. John Floyd.

Gloucester Co. court, May term, 1834. Evidence produced that Robert W., George S., Andrew S., and George D. Nicholson, children of Dr. George D. Nicholson; George W., Robinson, William A. W., and Reginald Heber Nelson, children of Sarah B. Nelson are the only surviving heirs of Dr. Robert Nicholson who was a Surgeon in the Rev. war., and that said Robert Nicholson died 15th Aug., 1798. Copy teste, Arthur Davies, Clerk.

From a letter to John G. Mosby, dated May 11, 1834. "Court held Monday, 5th. I qualified as guardian to my children. On Saturday the last day of court Robt. W. Nicholson qualified as guardian of his brother A. S. Nicholson and Maj. Penin(?) as guardian of Jas. M. Nicholson at the Middlesex Court, but the court would not appoint a guardian for George Nicholson the other brother as he was absent at the University of Va. Dr. Robert Nicholson died at the Hot Springs, on the 15 Aug., 1798, intestate. His wife qualified as Admstrx. of his estate. During his illness, there was a Col. Trueheart of Hanover Co. with him and kindly attended to him and wrote to his wife. The lawyers here seem to be very ignorant of Revolutionary matters. P. S. I went to York office on Monday and found that Mrs. Nicholson has given bond of \$5000. Probably Dr. Selden of Loudon Co. and Mr. Ludwell Lee of Prince William or Loudon can give the necessary information in regard to Dr. Nicholson's service. The former was on the medical staff at York until the close of the war. The latter was there acting as Aide to General Lafayette". Signed R. Nelson.

Burgess. Virginia Soldiers of 1776

Matthew Nightengale, boatswain, allowed Bounty Land for three years service.

James Nightengale, only heir to Matthew Nightengale (James' late father) had ~~the~~ correspondence with the government concerning the fact that Matthew should have received more land than he actually did. Said his father was in the Virginia State Navy for Revolution - boatswain. That he, Matthew Nightengale, died in Northumberland Co, Virginia, where he had lived, around 1794 or 1795; that he had left no will.

Northumberland, Virginia-

Births-

7 April 1778. born. James Nightengale, son of Matthew and Ann.

(This takes care of the James who wanted to know about the land his father hadn't received. But does this make four Matthew Nightengales? Polly's father Matthew was still married to Lucy at this time "Matthew and wife Lucy-" Matthew Junior - probably Polly's brother? married later, and that other one who married in Goochland married a Judith-??

### THE LADY FOOD SHOPPER

By Earl Nightingale

A supermarket chain did some research and came up with a composite picture of the lady who buys the food for the family. I found it interesting; see how it fits in your family.

The typical shopper is a 35 year old gal with two kids. The family has a car and an income of about \$6,000 a year. At about three on Friday afternoon she hops in the car — half the time bringing the children — and drives two miles to the supermarket. She's been shopping at this store for a little over two years.

She feels prices at most supermarkets are about the same. And it's the service and the people in the store that make the difference to her. Supermarket shopping today is not nearly as impersonal as one might think. Time and again it is obvious that Mrs. Consumer's feelings about the people and the services that the supermarket provides, color her entire opinion of the store. When she likes the people and services, it seems the aisles are wider, the meat fresher and the produce better. She buys some groceries at one or two other stores each week, but does the bulk of her shopping in her favorite store.

As she enters the store, she is confronted with shelves and cases displaying more than 7,000 food and household items. She does not carry a shopping list — 70% of the shoppers don't. She uses the supermarket itself as a reminder to buy as she shops the aisles.

Her shopping tour takes her 29 minutes, half of which is spent shopping the perishables departments — meat, produce, bakery, dairy and frozen foods. The rest of the time is spent shopping the grocery aisles and checking out.

Please excuse the paper! I am quite positive that I have seen Matthew Nightingale in Kentucky data, but I can't locate it. I'll keep looking, but it does not show in any of my indexed data.

This folder is a bit torn for I can't get any more good ones and used an old one. The new ones are quite thin.

Matt. seems to have been an educated man. I've indexed all data in wills for persons with last names beginning with A through L. I have all others abstracted, but not indexed. I have checked indexes from A through L and in C will data I have this: Will Book 2:7 of Guardian acct. by Lucas Powell for his wards, Charlotte and Courtney Cooper, orphans of Philip Cooper - from Jan. (?/1, 1779 - Mr. Rhodes for one month of schooling; Matt. Nightingale for same. Recorded Aug. 5, 1782.

In Impressed Property Claims in Order Book, 1773-1782 - page 496 - Matt. Nightingale was paid £4 for "a fine well fixt British musket" per certificate of 5 Jan, 1781.

Douglas Register - p. 36 - Matthew Nightingale and Lucy Rantow - both in this parish -

Dec. 26, 1759 (Page 5 of original).

P. 261 of published work and 63 of original - Catherine  
- daughter of Matt. & Lucy Nightingale - baptized Aug. 6,  
1762; born June 22, 1762 P. 261 (p. 70 of original) -  
Lucy Nightingale, daughter of Matt. & Lucy Nightingale,

He seems to have owned land which must  
have been bought before 1761 (may be in Albemarle deeds for  
we were out from it in 1761) - Same book - p. 368 - Aug. 3,  
1772, M. N. & us, Lucy, to Jas. Merrill (Merrill) £200 for  
333 acres on South side Rockfish and both sides of Carbon  
creek, lines of Jas. Small; one that is now Puckett's (?)  
on Rockfish; David Reid; late Col. Chiswell; Nichl.  
Montgomery; Alex. Reid; Francis Meriwether.

I imagine that all of this is old hat for  
you have worked here. I'll merely cite deeds in E: 60; 313;  
416; 421 to Nichl. Wren; Edm. Wilcox; Benj. Forsythe;  
& Wm. Camden. In Wren deed M. N. & Lucy sell the 150 a. from  
Eaton. Wilcox is mortgage - 1782; Forsythe is mortgage in  
1783 and Cath. Nightingale was a witness;

I don't know when O. Coffey left, but I have  
idea that M. N. left soon after this 1783 marriage of his  
daughter. I have abstracted deal book F and arranged in order  
names in tax, survey, and polls and don't see him in 1784 of  
lists. I did not check for O. Coffey. Write County Clerk  
of Lincoln Co., Ky., at Stanford. Be sure to enclose stamps!  
This won't guarantee reply for I think that some Ky. clerks  
have been told by doctors to eat nothing save stamps! I be-  
lieve that Ky. clerks have bad reputation, in main, when  
it comes to replies. I've been stung by several myself.

Lincoln Co. is one of three original ones in old Fincastle Dist. of Ky. Their records are fine and I found my Banta-Hluck marriage in the office. Here one writes Circuit Clerks, but over home you contact County Clerks. I feel sure that I've seen Matt. in some data from Lincoln, but I just can't place it.

Aren't there any libraries in Chicago area which buy Va. data? I recall what you told me about Newberry and took them off of my list. A Memphis genealogist sent me his list for study and I told him not to waste stamps on Newberry!

I now have deeds from 1761 (A) through book I: Impressed Claims (that is why it was easy to tell about that musket. These claims have been arrayed by yours truly and Mrs. Sweeney missed some. This item gives you an extra bar, if you are a D.A.R. or member-ship, if not.)

Matt. lived in what was to become Nelson in 1808. Coineon put out a booklet on Nelson and lists him as early Nelson settler. We lost half of Amberst to Nelson in 1808.

I also have all of these will book items abstracted and indexed (26 books - 1761-1920) with thousands of names in A through L last names. I've also done marriages, 1801-1854. I am offering big discounts for I am crowded for room, but don't have a Chicago outlet on my list.

This is all "Even Stephen" as far as any additional fee. I'll appreciate any names of libraries buying Virginia data!
