Chaplin, Phebe, Spinster, Da of Do (ditto) born
Jan. 25, 1717, bapt. May 31, 1735, married
by Do (ditto) May 31, 1735 Joseph Jenkins,
Bach.

Very evidently Mary Ann Chaplin and Phebe
Chaplin were sisters. Phebe was baptized the
day she was married - think it is still a
rule that the rector of an Episcopal Church
will not marry a person who is not baptized.
So you see the "Phebe" goes back behind the
generation of this Mary Ann and Phebe
Chaplin. Their mother was Phebe Radson,

daughter of John Ladson and Mary Stan-
yame Ladson. Unless there is a lost genera-
tion there, which is always possible. I have
never known the name of the wife of the
original John Ladson, Immigrant ances-
tor who came ^{with} wife, children, hired servants
and 3 slaves who came from St. Michael's
Town (now Bridgetown) Barbadoes. She is
not named, by name, in any deed or
document I ever found. She might very
well have been "Thoabe Waight" for, before
Ladson ever came Jacob Waight of Ashley
River and Francis Ladson were appointed
to act as John Ladson's attorneys - also
the Waights and the Ladsons were all
Quakers.

I cannot find my reference source for
the line Thoabe in (1) Caleb Toomer

(2) Jonathan Norton
Underneath this entry - Note in handwriting
of Mary Fraser Ladson,
Eld. dau. James H.
Ladson. She was b Jan-
1819 - d. unmarried
Aug 20, 1861.

I may have found this entry in the Ladson
file in S. C. H. & G. Society room in Ch'tn. I know

I did not dream it up, for I had never heard the name "Tomer". Wherever I got it, I began to question its accuracy, for Mary Ann Chap-
len is described as a "Spinster" in the parish register of St. Helena's - if she had been mar-
ried before surely she would be listed
"wid."

"John Radson came to Carolina from the Barbados 1679, in company with Sir John Yeamans." (Cannot check this, but think Yeamans came before that.) ... His wife was Mary, the daughter of Col. James Stanyarne. (Wrong, his wife was Mary, dau. of Thomas Stanyarne, is so named as "Mary Radson in the will, of which you have a photostatic copy.) Their daughter Phoebe Radson (1691-1764) married John Chaplin who had a grant on Stono. (correct) Their daughter Phoebe Chaplin (1718-1794) married, 1735, Joseph Jenkins, the son of Joseph Ap Jenkins and Martha, his wife. Joseph Jenkins, the younger, founded first Episcopal Church on Edisto Island, 1760, giving large sums to its establishment. Joseph, Sr., always signed his name "Ap

Jenkins: His two grants of land called "Sea Cloud" and "Black Hall" descended to the Townsends, through their mother, Phoebe Waight Jenkins.

A daughter of Joseph Jenkins, Jr., Phoebe Jenkins, 1743-1816, married William Waight,

Their daughter Phoebe Waight, married William Elliott III.

(I found a number of Phoebe Waight in the St. Helena Register, but all much too late in time.)

If your friend descends thru Phoebe Chaplin who married Jenkins I am afraid the line to the Nortons breaks right there, for one Chaplin daughter - of two sisters - married a Norton - the other a Jenkins.

Baptisms

Hanna the daughter of John Norton and Francis [sic] his wife was baptized Sept 18, 1636

Elizabeth, the dau. of John Norton & Francis his wife was bapt. Feb. 24, 1638/9.

John Norton, the son of John Norton was bapt. 30th October, 1641.

Burials

Hanna the dau. of John Norton was buried Nov. 23rd, 1640.

No marriages were found.

This does not get us too much

evidently" my loving brother

the continued use of the name Hanna,
or Hannah, leads me to believe
that some Hannah may have
been the mother of George & John.
George leaves legacies to sisters
Mary & Hannah, and provides in
his will for daus. Mary & Hannah.

"my said son John" evidently liked
this part of the world for he came back
in 1670 to help settle Charleston. John
was also named "sole and only executor
of this my last Will and Testament". The
will was probated on May 12th, 1665,
Elij. Turner thinks she can correct the
wrong letters on her typewriter & I will
then have copies made for you & Jess.
I don't like the name, late in the will
changing to Morton instead of Norton.
Tho I do know that in old docu-
ments sometimes a name is spelled
differently in two succeeding lines.
But I don't want the record to go down
incorrectly. So glad you are feeling better,
but advise that you stop at 115 lbs.
my love to you both, mother

to you and to sense, we
have never heard whether either
map arrived safely. Please drop
me a line. I have received certified
copy of the Will of George Norton,
dated "Ye third day of May in the
year of Our Lord God one thousand
six hundred sixty and five, and in
the seventeenth year of the reign of
Our Sovereign Lord Charles the Sec-
ond by the Grace of God King of
England &c." It has one or two
wrong letters, whether due to the
carelessness of the clerk who copied
it into the record almost three
hundred years ago, or the careles-
ness of a typist of today I do not
know. It begins I, George Norton,
and contains a bequest to "my
loving Brother Mr. John Norton
of Killingworth in ye County of
Warwick, Gentl." As I have written

(Believe this was the daughter of Gideon Nor-
ton who m (1) Anne Thomas (2) Ann Power.
Accidentally killed his first wife. While showing
her his gun, which he had just cleaned, gun
went off. Left "several young children". Gideon
may have been a son & John.
