TO ALL TO WHOM THIS CONCERNS: Greetings!

This is in response to your request for the genealogy of the OLIVER family. However, I must say that this genealogy is not complete. Indeed, in the stricter sense no genealogy is complete.

This genealogy dates back to about the time (or before) of the American Revolution. From there it shows the main line to the present generation. The branches from the main line have not been run. The reason is that it would be too time consuming and too much travel which of necessity would make it too expensive. Although that could be done. Anyone living in this present generation can take the information herein contained and trace his or her genealogy without a great deal of bother.

As such it comes as a well-wisher. Fare Ye Well.

William Oliver and his younger brother, Samuel Louis Oliver, moved from the Roanoke, Virginia area to the Pee Dee section of South Carolina after the Revolution.

Samuel Louis Oliver and his wife and children settled in the Centenary section of Marion County, South Carolina. Their children were:

(Note: the foregoing information has come from the records but to my knowledge is no proof of certainty of it. William Oliver was b. 1774 and Samuel Louis Oliver was b. 1817; in view of a 43 year age difference in the two men it is not likely that they were brothers. It is my opinion that William Oliver was the father of Samuel Louis Oliver. If further documentation or proof of relationship is forth-coming, it can be inserted in this book. TCV).

The Will of William Oliver was made April 8, 1823; it was recorded January 5, 1824. He evidently died between these dates. In his Will he named his children as John, Joseph D., Mary, Daniel W., Samuel L., and Eliza Ann. It is this family of Olivers that we are dealing with.

This genealogy is based in a practical sense on the available material at hand.

### THE NAME OF OLIVER

According to Elsdon C. Smith in his book called "The Story of Our Names" on page 25 there were, at about the year 1950, an estimated 144,000 boys with the given name of OLIVER in the United States.

At about that same time, in Elsdon C. Smith's, American Surnames, there was an estimated 114,400 people in the United States that bore the name of OLIVER as a surname.

Mr. Smith also says that the name OLIVER is both English and French, the difference being that the French spell it OLIVIER, whereas the English and our anglicised spelling is OLIVER.

In his book American Surnames page 198 Mr. Smith says this: "OLIVER 'olive grove' in France."

So according to this there was evidently a man in France that was the owner, or husbandman, of an olive grove from which the name of OLIVER originated.

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT  
of William Oliver.

In the name of God, Amen. I, William Oliver of South Carolina, Horry District, Allsaints Parish; being in a low state of health but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be unto God for the same, calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following:

I Will and Desire that my affectionate wife Rebecca Oliver shall live and be supported on my plantation where I now reside as long as she remains a widow, or until my youngest child becomes of age;

I give to my son, John Oliver, one dollar to be paid by my Executors. I also Will and Desire the property which I got by my son Joseph D. Oliver to be equally divided between my four children: Mary Oliver--Daniel W. Oliver--Samuel L. Oliver, and Eliza Ann Oliver after she becomes of age .

I give and bequeath unto my affectionate son Daniel W. Oliver my plantation where I now reside as far as the Gentle Woman Branch; from there strait (straight) out to Joseph Dewitt Sr's line. Also one Mahogona Dining table together with my hand mill and grind stone. I give and bequeath to my son Samuel L. Oliver the remaining part of my land belonging to the tract where I now live. Also I Will and Desire the rest of my land equally divided between my two sons Daniel W. Oliver and Samuel L. Oliver after my youngest child Eliza Ann Oliver becomes of age. I give and bequeath unto my affectionate daughter Eliza Ann Oliver one negro man, Peter, to be given up to her when she becomes of age; but in case my daughter Eliza Ann Oliver should die leaving no lawful issue then this negro man, Peter, is to return to my two sons Daniel W. Oliver and Samuel L. Oliver, or the survivors of them two.

I further Will and Desire that my stock of every kind with my household and kitchen furniture and plantation tools shall remain on my plantation with my Executors for the youce (use) of said plantation until my youngest child becomes of age, Eliza Ann Oliver. Then my stock, household and kitchen furniture and plantation tools is to be equally divided between my four children: Daniel W. Oliver--Samuel L. Oliver--Mary Oliver--and Eliza Ann Oliver.

I do nominate and constitute and appoint Daniel W. Oliver and Samuel L. Oliver sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament. I do hereby revoke and make void all and every other Will or Wills heretofore by me made and do declare this to be my last Will and Testament.

In witness my hand and seal this 8th day of April, 1823.

Signed, sealed, and acknowledged by the above named William Oliver for his last Will and Testament in the presents (presence) of us who at his request and in his presents have subscribed our names as witnesses thereto.

BRIEF COMMENTARY  
-of  
Daniel W. Oliver Sr.

It appears that Daniel W. Oliver Sr., son of William W. Oliver and Rebecca DeWitt, was born in the year 1805 according to the 1850 Census record; but 1808 according to the 1860 Census record. Sometimes the census taker made mistakes. The 1860 Census and 1880 Census show him as being born 1808. I'm going to settle for that date.

This Daniel W. Oliver Sr., seems to be the progenitor of the Horry County Olivers as of today. These are the only ones I have come in contact with. Give this careful study!

The 1850 Census is the first census that gives the names of the members of the family. All previous censuses gave the name of only the Head of the family. So the 1850 Census is the first one that lists the names of the children of Daniel W. Oliver Sr., and his wife Frances. They are as follows:

Daniel W. Oliver Sr., was a considerable land owner in Horry County. In the Archives at Columbia, S.C., there are at least three plats for land for him bearing dates of the years 1835 for 513 acres; 1840 for 781 acres; 1846 for 1500 acres, making a total of well nigh 3,000 acres. I have one of the plats in my files which I will quote:

"I do hereby Certify for Daniel W. Oliver, a tract of land containing Five Hundred & thirteen acres. Surveyed for him the 15th day of September 1835. Situate in Horry District in All Saints Parish; lying on the Sweet Water Branch & Cypress bay; branch waters of the Waccamaw River. Bounded N. W. by Peter Cox's land. N. E. & S. E. by vacant land. S. W. by the Estate of Thos. Fearwell, and the road leading from Cox's Ferry to Waccamaw Neck. And hath such form and marks as the above Plat Represents.

Given under my hand this 3rd Dec. 1835.

3 FAMILY OF DANIEL W. OLIVER, son of William W. OLIVER  
and Rebecca DeWitt.\*

Daniel W. Oliver was born in 1808 in Horry County, South Carolina, and died in the year 1892, according to the best references I have found. His burial place is unknown to the writer. However, it is highly possible that he might be buried in All Saints Parish Church Cemetery near Pawley's Island with a wooden marker at his grave, which has rotted out leaving no trace of his burial place. That is often the case.

Daniel W. Oliver was married to Frances Durant, who was a daughter of Thomas Durant. And as of this date that is all the information I have of her except that she was born in 1806 according to the 1850 Census of Horry County.

He was married, apparently, a second time, to a woman by the name of Mary E. \_\_\_\_\_ . She shows in the 1860 Census as being 27 years younger than Daniel W.

The children of Daniel W. and Frances Oliver are:

- 3-A Joseph D. Oliver, born in 1829 in Horry County, South Carolina. In about 1849 he married Elizabeth Jane McMillan of Marion County, who was born 1831 and died 1914. Joseph D. died in 1863.
- 3-B Samuel L. (or J) Oliver, was born 1832 in Horry County, S.C. He was married to Mary Jane Walsh, who was born July 1837. According to the 1900 Census, Bucks Township, she was the mother of 13 children, eight of which reached the age of maturity. Among these eight was Emma C. Oliver which became the wife of Joseph Milton Marlowe of Conway, S. C.
- 3-C Elizabeth Ann Oliver, B: June 26, 1834 in Horry County, and married John James Woodard on November 8, 1853.
- 3-D William Oliver, B: 1838 in Horry County, married first Mary Woodward. He married secondly Mrs. Catherine Haigler.
- 3-E Daniel W. Oliver Jr., born 1840 in Horry County and died 1917. He was married to Mary Elizabeth T. DeWitt, and they are both buried in Centenary Methodist Cemetery, near Conway, S.C.  
Centenary Methodist Church Cemetery is in the Savannah Bluff community on Highway 544.
- 3-F John Marion Oliver, born 1842 in Horry County and died 1907. He was married to Elizabeth Hardee, who was born 1843 and died 1933. They are both buried in Lakeside Cemetery, Conway, S.C.

\* The maiden-family name of Rebecca DeWitt Oliver, wife of William W. Oliver, is not proven, although the indications are that it is authentic.

No doubt you will notice a difference in the dates of births and deaths, here and there, possibly throughout this genealogy.

This discrepancy is due to the difference of dates on grave markers and the dates as given in the different Census records. The only way to correct this is thru Bible records; and even this is sometimes incorrect. I'm sorry this is the case.

3-A Family of Joseph D.Oliver, son of Daniel W.Oliver Sr., and Frances Durant.

Joseph D.Oliver was born 1829 and died in 1863. In about 1849 he married Elizabeth Jane McMillan, who was born 1831 and died 1914. She was a daughter of Neil McMillan and Sarah Wilson. The children of Joseph D. and Elizabeth Jane McMillan Oliver are as follows:

"~~Sister~~ Mary Jane Rheuark, daughter of David M. and Hester Ann Hucks, and wife of Brother George D.Rheuark, born February 19,1855 and departed this life February 25,1918, age 63 years and five days. She was married to brother Rheuark February 12,1874..... She also has one brother William B.Hucks of Toddsville,S.C." signed/ W.H.Perry, Pastor.

Surviving are her widower of the home; three sons, George A.Oliver Jr.,Patrick Arthur "Pat" Oliver, and Michael Vernon "Mike" Oliver,all of Conway; two daughters, Mrs.Alex (Helen Caroline)Hester, Mrs.Gary(Joanna Elizabeth) Doig, both of Myrtle Beach;

two brothers, Arthur Kelly Goldfinch Jr., Conway, William Trapier "Bill" Goldfinch, Danlington; two sisters, Mrs. R. Grant (Elizabeth) Singleton, Myrtle Beach, Mrs. David H. (Claire) Riggs, Gastonia, N.C., and four grandchildren.

Funeral services were Sunday from the Goldfinch Funeral Chapel, with the Rev. Ben Cunningham, officiating. Burial followed in Lakeside Cemetery.

3-A-1-b George Theodore Oliver died in 1948 and was buried in the Conway Cemetery which was located just beyond Glass Hill on the Longs Road, (Hwy 905). This cemetery was about half way between the crest of Glass Hill and Langston Memorial Baptist Church, on the Kingston Lake side of the road. It seems that Lakeside Cemetery which was on the opposite side of the lake had filled up...all grave sites taken. Hence the new cemetery.

There was at least one freshet when the Conway Cemetery was flooded, and quite a number of the vaults floated to the surface. Several persons witnessed that so it seems to be a matter of fact.

On the 25th day of September 1954 George Theodore Oliver, along with others, was moved from the Conway Cemetery to the Hillcrest Cemetery which is just a few miles from Conway on the road to Socastee (Hwy.544).

Clarence Leo Oliver "Brick" was buried in this same cemetery and was moved to Hillcrest Cemetery the same day as his father. "Brick" had been killed in action during World War II in France. T.C.V.

George Theodore Oliver was a veteran of the Spanish American War. He was a Private in Company M. 2 South Carolina Infantry. He was born October 31, 1876 and died December 27, 1948.

Clarence Leo Oliver, born February 9, 1907 and died Sept. 13, 1944; was Private in the 23rd S.C. Infantry Regiment; WWII B S M - P H.

Miss Jo Anna Oliver, 80, of Central Mobile Home Village died at 9:40 a.m. Wednesday at a local hospital. She had been suffering from a long illness.

Services were 3 p.m. Thursday at the Goldfinch Funeral Home. Burial was in Hillcrest Cemetery.

Miss Oliver was born in Horry County, a daughter of the late George Theodore and Mary Ida Dunn Oliver. She was a member of First United Methodist Church. Prior to retirement she was a book-keeper with General Telephone Company.

Surviving are one brother, George Alton Oliver Sr, of Conway; one sister, Mrs. Westaline O. Bass of Conway; two aunts, Mrs. Minnie D. Baldwin of Columbia, and Mrs. Etta C. Dunn of Conway.

Isaac G.Long came to Horry County from North Carolina  
according to the 1850 Census (Family # 905) and settled in  
what is now known as Longs,S.C.,between Loris and Ocean  
Drive Beach. The Long family is a prominent family in  
Horry County.

Isaac G.Long was Judge of the Probate Court of Horry  
County in 1871-1872. He was again elected and served in  
this capacity from 1874 to 1878. He leaves a long line of  
illustrious descendents, many of whom are with us today.

\*3-A-3-d Albert Harmon Long continued:

The following appeared in the Field and Herald of September 30, 1981: "Albert Harmon Long Jr., 54, of No. 75 Litchfield By The Sea, died Saturday in a Charleston hospital

Services were 11 A.M. Monday from the Goldfinch Funeral Chapel. Burial was in Lakeside Cemetery.

Mr. Long was born in Mullins, a son of Mrs. Alma Watson Long of Conway and the late Albert Harmon Long. He was a member of All Saints Waccamaw Episcopal Church; sons of the American Revolution; and a Navy veteran of World War II.

In addition to his mother, surviving are his widow, Mrs. Ann Childress Long of Litchfield Beach; one daughter, Mrs. Suzanne Smith of North Myrtle Beach; one brother, Charles Watson Long of Rock Hill; two sisters, Mrs. Rupert Stalvey of Conway, and Mrs. T.W. Turner of Charleston.

The family suggests that those so desiring may send memorials to the American Cancer Society."

Please pardon this oversight but we need to revert back to Mary Frances Oliver and Lorenza Dow Long (3-A-3) for just a moment.

They had a sixth child, namely, Lorenza Dow Long Jr., who was called "Little Doc" and who married Mary Roxanna Graham. She was born 1886 and died 1940. She and her husband are buried in Union Meth. Cemetery. They were the parents of two boys which I remember, Ansel Long, and one which was called "L.D.". L.D. took vocal music lessons and became a very acceptable soloist.

3-A-3-c Samuel Cephas Long, son of Mary Frances Oliver and Lorenza Dow Long, was born 1878, and died \_\_\_\_\_. He and his wife are buried in Pawley Swamp Baptist Church Cemetery.

On December 27, 1905 he married Lillian Mae Parker of the Pawley Swamp section of Horry County. She was a daughter of Francis M. Parker and Frances Elizabeth Smart.

To this union was born the following children:

- 1 Samuel Heyward Long who married Addie Richardson.
- 2 Lillian Mozelle Long.
- 3 Frances Louise Long who married Wm. A. "Buddie" Martin.

3-A-3-e Mary Frances Long, B: Sept. 1881 D: 1968. She married Albert M. Dusenbury. They are buried in Union Meth. Cemetery. Mr. Dusenbury was born 1870 and died in 1943.

- 2 Mary Frances Dusenbury, born 1903 died 1932.
- 3 Bessie Dusenbury, married L.W. Heriot.
- 4 James R. Dusenbury, born about 1908. I was told he served a "stretch" in the Navy after which he became a long distance transport truck driver. The last I heard of him he was in California.

The following was taken from the I.R.Q. of October 1970, page 22, by T.C. Vaught.

"Mrs. Albert M. Dusenbury, born Fancy Long of the Greenwood section, near Toddville. Her parents were Mary Frances Oliver and L.D. Long, one time treasurer of the County.

Mrs. Dusenbury attended Conway schools, then went to Marion and stayed with some McMillan relatives to attend school there. About 1897 when she was sixteen, she began to teach in four schools a year. During these years she boarded in homes that had no heat and walked or rode a bicycle to



school. Later she took an examination in Conway for a life certificate. In 1921 she taught in Horry's first night school founded by Miss Wil Lou Gray as a pilot program in the state. The schools were called "Sign Your Name" clubs. Here she taught two of her trustees to sign their names".

3-A-5 Family of Joseph Daniel Oliver, B:13 April 1859, and died 1942. He is buried in Union Meth.Cemetery. On October 28,1884 he married Mary Selena Haigler. Their children are:

- a Leila Estelle Oliver, B:Oct.9,1886 D:1965. She was married to Charles Albert Rheuark in 1907. She is buried in Union Meth.Cemetery. I'm not quite sure about Mr.Rheuark's burial place.
- b Katherine Elizabeth Oliver, B:Mar.7,1890. I have no record of the death or burial place of either her or her husband, who was Samuel McMartin, and whom she married in 1916.
- c Mary Frances Oliver, B: Sept.7,1891 and died in 1970. In 1919 she married Julian T.Perritt who,at age 92 died shortly before Christmas of 1985. They are both buried in Lakeside Cemetery at Conway. He was born in Marion County.
- d Margaret Stroman Oliver, B:Aug.24,1893, and at this writing lives on the Georgetown Highway on the north side of Bear Creek (or Swamp). Which is about 5 miles from Conway.  
In 1921 she married Archie Maston Gasque who was born 1897 and died 1960. He is buried in Union Meth.Cemetery. Archie and his wife had a son, Francis Lamar, who was born 1928 and died in 1953.My understanding is that his death was the result of an airplane accident. He is also buried in Union Cemetery.
- e Jessie Oliver, born March 15,1897 and died in 1913. She, also, is buried in Union Cemetery.
- f Fancy Lee Oliver, B:June 10,1899, and died at the age of 83, and is buried in Union Meth.Cemetery. She was married to Samuel Austin Dusenbury who is also buried in Union Cemetery.

Mrs.Dusenbury was a daughter of Joseph Daniel and Mary Haigler Oliver. She and her husband were the parents of one daughter, Anne Elizabeth Dusenbury of Toddville.

This completes the genealogy of the family of 3-A,Joseph D.Oliver, son of Daniel W. and Frances Durant Oliver, and his wife Elizabeth Jane McMillan.

We are indebted to Mrs.Leila Estelle Oliver Rheuark for the most of this part of the Oliver genealogy; and certain other parts also.

3-E-1 Anna Rebecca Oliver, B:1866 D:1936. She was a daughter of Daniel W. and Mary Elizabeth DeWitt Oliver. She was married to Thomas Beaty Cooper who was a merchant of the Socastee area of Horry County. Mr. Cooper was born in 1863 and died 1928. They are both buried in Socastee Cemetery, and the foregoing dates are based on the Socastee Cemetery catalogue. To this union was born the following children:

a Thomas Beaty Cooper Jr., called "Doc". He was born 1896 and died in 1973. He is buried in Lakeside Cemetery at Conway, S.C. He had served as a Corporal in the United States Army in World War One.

Doc Cooper was married to Miss Sallie Lucas who was born in 1895. At the time of this writing Mrs. Cooper is resting in a nursing home at Charleston, South Carolina.

b Carrie Cooper

c Madie Cooper, married Julian Sarvis Jr., a one-time employee of the Atlantic Coast Line Railway.

d Julian Beaty Cooper, B:1901 D:1959. He is buried in Lakeside Cemetery at Conway. On February 9, 1921 he was married to Miss Sarah Page Chestnut, daughter of William Hampton and Sarah Jane Page Chestnut.

e Roberta Cooper, B:                    D:1967 ?  
She married George Cox.

f Thelma Cooper, married Fred Martin.  
Sometime after Thelma died Fred married Reva Cook Salmon, who was the widow of W.R. Salmon of Conway.

g Maude Cooper, married a White.

h Legrand Cooper ?

We have the above family information thru the kindness of Elwood Cook Russo and Eva Mae Dunn Stalvey.

I'm sorry we couldn't gather more genealogical data on this family.

LAW OF HEREDITY: If your parents didn't have any children, chances are you won't either.

3-E-2 WINDHAM T. OLIVER, commonly called "Doad" was born Dec. 1868, and died 1904. Born in Horry County he was a son of Daniel W. Oliver Jr., and Mary Elizabeth DeWitt. It is said that he was an employee of the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad Company, and in his line of duty one day he was involved in an accident in which one of his legs was severed. He bled to death before a physician could be reached.

Windham T. Oliver was married to Frances Elizabeth Murrell on October 10, 1889. She was born in April 1871, and died 1954. They are both buried in Centenary Methodist Church Cemetery.

Frances Elizabeth Murrell was a daughter of Alfred G. and Frances A. Murrell of the Salem Methodist Church Community on Highway 90, some six or eight miles from Conway, S.C.

Alfred G. and his wife Frances are buried about a mile from the Salem Church. Directly in front of the church is the cemetery. Facing the cemetery, in the left hand corner of the cemetery is the Murrell burial lot, where several members of the Murrell family are buried. However, Alfred G. and his wife are not buried there.

Just to the left of the cemetery is a dirt road leading back (in a sort of Y shape) to what the records show as Murrell's Landing, and Lee's Mill. Just before the entrance to Murrell's Landing, (a hundred yards or so) on the left is where Alfred G. and his wife are buried.

Garland Murrell and I went out there to look for their graves. It has grown up and there is no evidence that this land was ever cultivated. With careful searching one can see from the dirt road a slab about sixteen inches high and about six or eight inches wide which represents the head, and a shorter one for the foot of the grave. This is a wooden slab with no markings on it. I guess nature has taken her toll. Garland said that was his grandfather. And right beside this grave was a sink in the ground, the right length for a grave, which he said was his grandmother. This is about a mile from Highway 90.

Windham T. and Frances Elizabeth are the parents of the following children:

a Daniel Albert Oliver, born Oct. 1892, served in World War One. I quote from Elwood, "Albert didn't come home after the war, but aunt Fannie found him in West Virginia." I have learned since that Albert was buried in Arlington National Cemetery, and that he was married to Miss Lucille Robinson.

b Mazie Oliver, B: Feb. 5, 1894 and died Feb. 16, 1963. On the 17th of July 1917 she married Dr. Olin West Watson, who was born October 3rd. 1895, and died November 26, 1966. He was a son of Rev. Emory Olin Watson and Mattie West, whom I understand are buried at Leesville, South Carolina.

The Dr. Olin Watsons are both buried in Hillcrest Cemetery. Olin West Watson was a Pharmacist. He and his wife became the parents of the following children:

1 Mary Frances Watson, B: June 21, 1924. She married Robert Hilton McBride who was born July 5, 1919 and died September 12, 1977. He was a Presbyterian Elder. They were married January 25, 1946. They had two children:

Robert H. McBride Jr., and Olin Watson McBride.

2 Olin West Watson Jr., B: May 18, 1918 D: June 30, 1980. He married Josephine Cox. They were the parents of three daughters.

Dr. Olin West Watson had a twin brother who was known as "Pete", but whose real name was Maxey Pierce Watson. He and his wife, Grace Haselden are also buried in Hillcrest Cemetery.

3-E-2 Windham T. "Doad" Oliver family continued.

- c Jesse James Oliver, born May 1896.  
Jesse married an English girl whose given name was Muriel. I never knew her family name, but she was very pretty. Elwood said "Jesse and his wife Muriel lived across the street from me in Conway, and they had one daughter whose name was Betty." At one time Jesse was a traveling salesman for a tobacco Co. He was a handsome man and he was also a twin.
- d Frank James Oliver, B: May 1896. Married Elizabeth \_\_\_\_\_.  
Frank and Jesse Oliver were twins.

I knew Jesse in a small way. He and his twin brother were ten years older than I. I knew Jesse when I was in my early teens. I didn't know Frank, but Elwood said "Frank lived in Oklahoma".

In one of her letters Elwood asked if I thought Don Oliver, who is a reporter for NBC TV, might be a descendent of some of these Olivers. She thought he was. And I'm inclined to agree with her.

She said she wrote to Don but received no answer to her inquiry. So she sent me his address, which she had gotten from NBC headquarters somewhere. I also wrote to him and explained to him what we were doing relative to this genealogy, and asked for his back-ground. I received no reply. But Elwood said her younger son looked very much like him.

I understand Jesse is buried in Greenlawn Cemetery at Columbia, S.C. And that Frank is buried in Tarpon Springs, Florida.

Joseph D. Oliver and Eva Mae Clardy.

Joseph D. Oliver, son of Daniel W. and Mary Elizabeth DeWitt Oliver, was born April 1871 and died 1950.

He was married to Eva Mae Clardy who was born March 1877 and died in 1962. There were no children by this marriage.

I don't know who the parents of Eva Mae Clardy Oliver were, but it is said that they died when Eva Mae was quite young, and that Eva Mae went to live with her grandmother Clardy, where she continued to live until her grandmother died. Then her father's brother, Mike Clardy, took her to his home and raised her to adulthood. It has been said, tho, that her uncle's wife wasn't good to her.

Eva Mae Dunn Stalvey was named for this aunt! And it was she that gave me this information.

Eva Mae also verified information concerning the Oliver twins.

3-E-4 Robert Lee OLIVER, son of Daniel W. Oliver Jr., and Mary Elizabeth DeWitt, was born 1874, and died 1944. He married Annie Horton (I have been able to gather no more information concerning her).

\* To this union was born two children...both boys:  
a Robert seems to have been the older. In my genealogical correspondence with Elwood Cook Russo I received a letter from her stating that "Robert Oliver, son of Robert Lee and Annie Horton Oliver, was murdered and put in his car and found in another state." (letter of May 13, 1982).

This was verified by other members of the Oliver family.

b Richard Oliver, son of Robert Lee and Annie Horton Oliver, lost his life in an automobile accident near Charleston, S.C.

This, also, was verified by Eva Mae Dunn Stalvey and Elwood Cook Russo.

This is all the information I have been able to come up with regarding this family...except the following:

\* "The men who committed this crime were apprehended and brought to trial. This trial was held in Conway, S.C., and they were convicted and sentenced to be executed, which was carried out in due form.

I am told this trial was covered by the News Media and printed in the Horry County Newspapers.

I wasn't living in Conway at this time and am not familiar with these happenings. Members of the Oliver family have verified this. It seems to have taken place around the early 1930s.

The mother of these young men stayed with the Dunns during the trial.

Eva Mae thinks they were electrocuted.

3-E-5 Mary Ella OLIVER "Ellen", B:May 8, 1877 D:April 17, 1920, daughter of Daniel W. Oliver and Mary Elizabeth DeWitt. Mary Ella Oliver married Robert Lee Dunn who was born January 4, 1873, and died March 19, 1940. He was a son of John Wesley and Josephine Sidney Patrick Dunn. Mary Ella and Robert Lee both are buried in Centenary Cem. To this couple was born the following children:

- \* a Grace Inez Dunn, B:May 6, 1897 D:Oct. 21, 1977, married Jennings Bryan Armstrong as his second wife. They are both buried in Centenary Meth. Cemetery.
- b Robert Lee Dunn Jr., "Bubba". B:Mar. 4, 1899 D: 1976. He married Lee Perlance Creel, daughter of Nick Creel and his wife, who was a Johnson, of Conway. Bubba is buried in Centenary Cemetery.
- c Emma Gatlin Dunn, B:Aug. 3, 1901 D: 1907. She is buried in Centenary Cemetery.
- d Lance Dunn, B:Nov. 13, 1903 D: 1907. He is also buried in Centenary Cemetery.
- e John Windham Dunn, "Jack", B:March 6, 1906 married Lillian Shelton. They live in High Point, N.C., at this writing.
- f Eva Mae Dunn, B:Nov. 9, 1908, married October 22, 1930 Rupert Irving Stalvey of Conway, S.C. Irving died May 31, 1975 and is buried in Hillcrest Cemetery. Eva Mae and Irving had two children, namely: Mary Louise, who married Charles Creel; and Rupert Miles who married Mary Ann Long, dau. of Albert Harmon Long Sr., and Alma Watson Long.
- g Berniece Elizabeth Dunn, B:Nov. 15, 1911, married Robert Ilderton Oliver on Sept. 13, 1931 at the Dunn home. Robert died Nov. 19, 1980, and is buried at Georgetown, S.C., where they lived for many years. Robert was a son of Capt. Wm. Louis Jr. and Emma Limehouse Oliver. Berniece and Robert were the parents of two sons: Robert Lee and Wm. Louis Oliver 3rd. They both served in the second World War in the Air Force.
- h Eulice Aubrey Dunn, B:January 19, 1914 married Dorothy Hyatt. Eulice served overseas in WWII. Eulice and Dorothy live in High Point, N.C.
- i Emmett Vance Dunn, B:April 22, 1916 D:Nov. 1, 1963. Emmett is buried in Centenary Cemetery.
- j Ella Elmont Dunn, B:April 17, 1920 D: 1965, and is buried in Centenary Cemetery. She married first Charles Dew. Her second marriage was to Robert L Montgomery, and to this union was born the following:
  - Robert L. Montgomery Jr., (Baptist minister)
  - "Pam" Montgomery (Motorcycle rider).
  - Sue Ellen Montgomery. (Nurse).

\*Jennings Bryan Armstrong married 1st Eva Victoria Stalvey, dau. of Francis Asbury and Mamie Sanders Stalvey. Born to them were two or three children which died in infancy,.

Eva Stalvey Armstrong was born Dec. 29, 1895 and died Sept. 1, 1947. She is buried in Centenary Cemetery There were no children by the Armstrong/Dunn marriage.

Daniel W. Oliver III, born February 28, 1881 in Horry County and died October 30, 1947 at High Point, North Carolina. He was buried in Floral Gardens Cemetery at High Point.

On December 10, 1906 he was married to Miss Cora A. Prince, who was born December 11, 1887 in Horry County, and died January 1, 1965 at High Point and is buried in Floral Garden Cemetery also. She is a daughter of Robert M. and Ada Lee Prince.

Daniel W. III is a son of Daniel W. Jr., and Mary Elizabeth DeWitt Oliver.

Clara Augusta Oliver, daughter of Daniel W. Oliver Jr., and Mary Elizabeth DeWitt, was born March 28, 1883 in Horry County, S.C. On the 28th day of February 1907 she married John Waterman Cook, son of James Jefferson and Thursea Woodward Cook, of the Pawley Swamp section of Horry County.

Mr. Cook was born March 31, 1873 and died April 29, 1931. He is buried in the Pawley Swamp Baptist Church Cemetery.

Following is an account of the above mentioned marriage, taken from the Horry Herald of Thursday March 7, 1907:

"Centenary Church, across the Waccamaw, was the scene of a lovely wedding on Wednesday of last week, the contracting parties being Miss Clara Oliver and Mr. J. W. Cook. The ceremony was performed by the Reverend D. A. Calhoun of Conway.

The bride is a daughter of Mr. Daniel W. Oliver, and a sister of our townsman, Mr. J. D. Oliver. She is well known in Conway where she has many friends. Mr. Cook is a brother of Mr. M. W. Cook of the Horry Hardware Company. He holds an important and lucrative position at Myrtle Beach, where Mr. and Mrs. Cook will make their home."

To this union the following children were born:

- a Frances Elwood Cook, B: August 2, 1908 at Pine Island. She married Gilbert Lothia Gregg of Conway on June 24, 1927. Gilbert was a son of David Frierson and Frankie Gilbert Gregg. Gilbert was born in Florence on 23rd of April 1904 and died December 15, 1970 in the Conway Nursing Center. He was buried on December 17, '70 in Mt. Zion Cemetery, near Loris, S.C. (Rt. 1).

Elwood and Gilbert lived together thirteen years and to this union were born four children:

- 1 A little girl was born to them on December 1, 1928. She was named for her two grandmothers Frankie Augusta Gregg. She was born in Conway and buried in Florence... Mt. Hope Cemetery. She died June 23, 1932.  
Elwood said in her letter of information, quote; "I loved her so much and had her such a short time".  
I understand there is no marker for her grave.
- 2 Gilbert Lothia Gregg Jr., B: December 27, 1929 at Conway. On April 6, 1953 he was married to Ethel Saphronia Coleman, and they were blessed with several children. Gilbert Jr. Gregg and his present wife live in Atlanta, Georgia.
- 3 Faye Hope Gregg, B: March 22, 1933 at Wilmington, N.C. She was married in New Port News, Virginia, to James Kennedy Bishop on November 26, 1955. Several children were born to this couple and they still live in New Port News.
- 4 Phillip Elwood Gregg, was born December 25, 1935 on Davis Island which is in the vicinity of Tampa Florida. He, too, lives in New Port News, Virginia, with his wife, Carol.

Gilbert Gregg Sr., was an employee of the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad Company, and that accounts, somewhat, for their children being born in different places.

After thirteen years of married life he and Elwood were separated. He married again and came back to South Carolina.

On April 2nd, 1947 Elwood was married to James Russo in Elizabeth City, North Carolina. He had served overseas in the 2nd World War in the U.S. Army. This marriage continued until her death. There were no children by this marriage. When James Russo and Elwood were married they continued to live in New Port News.

On August 9, 1977 Elwood became afflicted with an aneurysm of the brain. She had become overheated. She was rushed to the hospital where the doctors, nurses, and her family thought she would not live. I will quote "Anyway, the Dr. cut a vein that led to my brain and drained it." She was incapacitated for quite some time.

Elwood's mother, Clara Augusta Oliver Cook, lived with her for the last eight years of her life. Then she died on the 14th day of December 1973, and was buried in the cemetery where Elwood had purchased a sizeable lot, on which other members of her family were buried. Elwood said it snowed while she was buried. She said her mother loved the snow.

Elwood recovered from her illness to the extent that she lived a rather normal life (but quietly) until August 20, 1985 when death overtook her in Riverside Hospital at New Port News. She was buried in Peninsula Memorial Park, in her lot, on the 22nd of August with her mother and other members of her family.

Weymouth Funeral Home of New Port News was in charge of the funeral.

- b Marie Cook, B: February 28, 1912 at Conway, S.C. She was a daughter of John Waterman and Clara Augusta Oliver Cook. Marie was married to W.W. Fleming, whom I was told was a tobacco buyer. Marie and her husband became the parents of two sons: William W. Fleming Jr., and Reuben Hunter Fleming. I understand that each of these sons and their wives are the parents of two sons.

Marie died December 28, 1978 and is buried at New Port News, Va.

- c Clara Joyce Cook, was born May 4, 1915 at Aynor, South Carolina. She was married to Edward Olin Pendarvis, who, at this writing is Mayor of the City of Orangeburg, South Carolina, a position which he has held for quite some time.

Mr. and Mrs. Pendarvis are the parents of two daughters and a son, namely:

- 1 Shirley Jean Pendarvis is married to Dr. Thomas Guyton. Dr. and Mrs. Guyton live in Coral Gables, Florida. There are no children by this marriage.
- 2 Nancy Joyce Pendarvis was first married to Richard Coleman Pogue, who died. There were two children by this marriage--- Nancy Elizabeth Pogue and Richard Coleman Pogue Jr. Nancy Joyce Pendarvis is now married to Dr. Ronald J. Elliott, and they live in Columbia, South Carolina.

- f Ella Rebecca Cook, "Trixie", was born at Aynor on the 6th of April 1922. She was married to Col. Henry Merritt Fletcher. He preceeded her in death by just a few years.

They were the parents of: Henry M. Fletcher III, Rebecca Arden Fletcher, and James Oliver Fletcher. "Trixie" died April 27, 1976 and was buried at Arlington, Virginia.

- g George Durwood Cook, "Simon", was born June 1, 1925 at Conway, S.C. He died 23rd of October 1976. He was buried at Charlotte, N.C.

He was married to Florence Marie Reinfried. They had two children: Sharon Ann, and Jeffrey Alan.

Sherry, as she was called, married David Cannon.

3-E-10 Fannie Oliver, daughter of Daniel W. Oliver Jr. and Mary Elizabeth DeWitt was born in Horry County, South Carolina on 17th April, 1888. She died February 4, 1969 at Florence and was buried at Dillon, S.C., in the Riverside Cemetery.

The following appeared in the Horry Herald September 29, 1910:

"Miss Fannie Oliver, a charming young lady of the Socastee section of the County will be married to Mr. S. Oscar Clardy on October 5, 1910. Mr. Clardy is a young business man now residing at Verdrie, Florida, but he is a native of this County.

The friends of the couple will read this announcement with pleasure."

Samuel Oscar Clardy, son of Alexander and Mary Annie Clardy, was born October 7, 1883 in Horry County, South Carolina. He died on 14th of May 1952 and was buried in Riverside Cemetery at Dillon, S.C.

The children of the above marriage are as follows:

- a Cermette Justin Clardy, B: 29 July 1911 at Callahan, Florida. He died 31st of August 1984 at Charleston, S.C. and is buried in Riverside Cemetery at Dillon.  
Cermette had been married to Billie Cox, a nurse.
- b Armlon Woodrow Clardy, B: November 28, 1913 at Georgetown, S.C. He died 27th June 1962, and he, too, is buried in Riverside. Armlon was married to Vera Brown.
- c Mary White Clardy, B: 30th June, 1922 at Georgetown, So. Car. She was married to George Lester Rogers on the 18th day of December 1945. And at this writing she and her husband live at Garden City, one of the beaches near Murrels Inlet, S.C.

John Marion Oliver, son of Daniel W. Sr., and Frances Durant Oliver, was born 1842 and died 1907. He was married to Ann Elizabeth Hardee, who was born 1843 and died 1933. They are both buried in Lakeside Cemetery at Conway, S.C.

Joseph Hampton Oliver is the only one of the above children I have been able as, of now, to get any information on.

Joseph Hampton was born 1875 and died 1939. He was a printer. To this couple were born the following children:

John Marion Oliver, son of Daniel W. Oliver Sr, was Clerk of Court for Horry County in 1882. And again he was either elected or appointed to this office for the period of from 1884 to 1892.

Information concerning John Marion Oliver has been furnished by Mrs. William Leon Smith (Eloise Oliver Smith) of 1400 5th Avenue, Conway, S.C.

She said Joseph D. Oliver who was born 1859 was called "Sonny". So it seems that he would have been named for his father. However, that is not necessarily so.
