

In Wilkes Co., Ga., 1792, Capt. Slatter's Dist., No. 44, Henry Peebles was taxed on 250 a., 3rd quality, 545 a. pine land, and 1 free wh. m. under 60; In 1792, Capt. Prewitt's Dist., No. 61, Henry Peebles was taxed on 200 a., 2nd class, adj. Wm. Jones, 7 slaves, and 1 wh. poll, and 3 slaves. In Capt. Flukers Dist., 1793, he was taxed 1 wh. poll, 3 slaves.

In Wilkes Co., Ga., 1793, Henry Peebles had two grants of land: Jan. 8, 25 a. adj. Jesse Wright, Staples, Culpeper, Hicks and Harper; and Oct. 13, 455 a. adj. Parram (Parham), Brannon, Wm. Jones, and Fletcher. Surveys made in 1791. Warren Co. was cut from Wilkes, and in 1794, Warren, Capt. Slatter's Dist., No. 22, Henry Peebles was taxed 1 wh. poll, 7 slaves, 200 a. on Middle Crk., adj. Walker and Jones, and 600 a., adj. Culpeper and others. In 1799 he had a survey for 21-3/4 a. in Warren, for which grant was issued Dec. 16, 1802. It was on the waters of Middle Crk. adj. his own land.

There are numerous other refs. to him in the 1790s tax, including purchases and sales of land. In 1792 Wm. Pebies, free white over 21, no land, was taxed. There are two items repch. by Henry of "a negro boy, Kinchen". Some of Henry's land adj. land of Abner Fluellin and Alexander Flewellin on the waters of Rocky Comfort Crk., of which Middle Crk. is a tributary. In 1801 Isham Peebles appears, but no inf. regarding him. By that time, Henry was taxed on 23 black. In April, 1810, in the 21st Dist., he was Henry Peoples, Esq., and an Ensign in the Militia.

His will, made 24 Aug., 1829, prob. Mar. 1, 1830, gave to wife, Polly, 300 a. "pchd. of James Stapler", and another 300 a. part of tract Henry then lived on, and part of a tract granted to Jesse Wright. Also 18 slaves. He made bequests to: wife's 3 ch., Frances, Robert C., and Nancy M. Moreland; "my gr. dau. Clara B. Gilbert"; "other gr. children not herein mentioned." Signed H. Peebles. Wits., Dannie LiKyan (?), Geo. Cotton, Thos. Gibson.

Henry<sup>5</sup> Peebles is said to have had 22 grants of land in Gadsden and Jackson Counties, Florida.

Mary (Polly), his widow, who had been the Widow Moreland, was 40/50 in 1830, with 1 f. 10/15, 2 m. 20/30, 1 m. 10/15. She lived to be 100. A notice of her death, seen in the Savannah paper, gives that statement.

The ch. of Henry<sup>5</sup> Peebles, all of whom had married and left home before his death, were: Isham<sup>6</sup>, below. Thessy - or Katie, b. June 21, 1775, d. Oct. 10, 1819, bond for her m. 22 Feb., 1797, Warren Co., as Katie Peebles, to Alexander Fluellin. She d. Oct. 10, 1819. Jesse<sup>6</sup>, below. Mary (Polly), b. 1778, m. Oct. 26, 1795, Warren Co., to Jesse Matthews, who wit. deed Morgan Co., Feb. 11, 1811, by Dudley<sup>5</sup> son of David<sup>4</sup> Peeples, B-Lines. John<sup>6</sup>, below. Susannah, b. 1782 or abt. that, m. Jan. 4, 1804, Warren, by Archelaus Fluellin, J.P., to Dudley<sup>5</sup> Peeples, son of David<sup>4</sup> of Green Co., Ga. Wm. Henry<sup>6</sup>, b. c. 1785, given slaves by father in Feb., 1806, disappeared. Not ident. with any Wm. Henry found. Probably a dau. who m. a Lee, and died, had son Orren Lee, raised by his Uncle Jesse<sup>6</sup>. Elizabeth (Betsy) Peebles, b. c. 1790, m. a Gilbert, left dau. Clara named in Gr. f.'s will. A total of 4 sons, 5 daus.

Isham<sup>6</sup> (Isam) Peoples, b. c. 1771, lived Lanc. 1820-40 incl. He was briefly in Warren Co., Ga., 1801. He had 10 ch. Only dsct. located is the Mr. Tom

Peoples of Delta, Ala., who wrote Mrs. H. L. Peoples of Dallas in the 1930s, and verified the relationship. He d. in 1941, age 70. He was a Pensioner for Military service.

Jesse<sup>6</sup> Peebles, b. May 11, 1776, d. Sept. 10, 1836, both in S.C., m. July 25, 1796, Sumter Co., to Elizabeth Marshall, July 7, 1778--Aug. 5, 1857, dau. of James Marshall. They had 2 ch.: Sarah, m. her cousin, Lewis<sup>7</sup> Peebles, son of David<sup>6</sup>, see him; and William H., Exr. for his father.

Jesse<sup>6</sup> is found in a great number of records in Sumter Co., too many to copy. He was a J.P.; he patented land; he witnessed deeds; he bought and sold land. When David<sup>6</sup> made deeds of land to his various sons, he made Jesse<sup>6</sup> trustee. The Mills Atlas of S.C., pubd. 1820, shows the place Jesse<sup>6</sup> lived - about 13 mi. N.E. of the bridge over Scape Crk. He sold his son, Capt. Wm. H.<sup>7</sup> Peebles, for \$500, 389 a., Oran D. Lee one of wits. His will, in Bundle 1, Pkg. 1, leaves property to his wife, his dau., Sarah, and appts. son-in-law Lewis<sup>7</sup> Peebles and son, Wm. H.<sup>7</sup>, his Exrs. Will dated 7 July, 1836.

After Jesse's death his widow sold land to Henry E. L.<sup>8</sup> Peebles, which adj. land owned by Abigail Peebles and others. Jesse<sup>6</sup> and his wife, Mrs. Elizabeth, and his son-in-law Lewis<sup>7</sup> and wife Sarah, are buried in the graveyard at the "old Lewis Peebles place".

Oran D. Lee, a nephew of Jesse<sup>6</sup>, m. 23 Dec., 1828, to Susan McKenzie, b. 1810. In 1850, they had: Henry James Lee, b. Oct. 12, 1829, Mary C., b. 1831, Agnes H., b. 1833, Martha, b. 1835, Judie, 1836, Emma, 1838, Robert, 1840, Margaret, 1842, Sarah, 1844, Laura, 1845, Lawrence, 1846, Oran, 1848, and John, age 3/12.

Just before his father, Henry<sup>5</sup>, left Lancaster, Jesse made a visit to him, and wit. a deed.

William H.<sup>7</sup>, Dec. 16, 1799--Dec. 1, 1843, will prob. Dec. 12, m. Mar. 8, 1821, to Abigail Stuckey, Oct., 1802--July 9, 1891, age 88 yrs. and 9 mos. She was dau. of Edmund Stuckey. She and Wm. H. had 3 ch.: Henry E. Lawrence<sup>8</sup> Peebles, below. Sarah Angelina, Dec. 28, 1822--Feb. 8, 1891, m. Dec. 1, 1841, to Henry D. Crosswell, and had: John Lawrence, b. 1842, Elizabeth Abigail, b. 1844, Wm. Henry, June 12, 1846, Araminta Maria, Nov. 12, 1848, and Gertrude Vermell, Nov. 10, 1850. The 3rd ch. of Wm. H.<sup>7</sup> was Maria Frances, Nov. 1, 1824--May 26, 1883, m. 1842 to Thomas E. Baskin, had Wm. Peebles Baskin, b. 1843, m. 1866 to Sarah Ann Stuckey, had Eldridge Baskin who for many years practiced dentistry in Baltimore. He is now retired, lives S.C. He owns the Peebles Bible. Joseph E. Baskin, the other ch. of Wm. Peebles Baskin was b. June 25, 1845.

Henry E. Lawrence<sup>8</sup> Peebles, Dec. 27, 1821--July 20, 1898, m. Jan. 1, 1851, to Margaret Amanda Scarborough, Aug. 9, 1827--ante 1880. He served as 3rd Sgt. in the 19th Regt., Co. E., Inf., in Civil War. They had 6 ch.: Wm. Alfred Bonaparte<sup>9</sup> Peebles, June 29, 1852--July 12, 1898, m. to Annie P. \_\_\_\_\_, who, a widow, lived Sumter, no ch. Dr. Lawrence Henry<sup>9</sup>, 1853--Aug. 12, 1926, m. Oct. 16, 1875 to Jessie C. Wingo, 14 Mar. 1860--24 Nov., 1924, had dau. Laura

Weaver, J.P., perf. the m., Jackson Co., Ga. They went Ala. with her parents. William<sup>7</sup> Peoples, below. Robert W.<sup>7</sup> Peoples, below. Nancy, b. 1819 m. probably in Ga. to \_\_\_\_\_ Skipper, lived Parker Co., Texas at Whitt, had sons Brantley, lived Dallas, and Isom Lee Skipper. Benjamin Franklin<sup>7</sup>, b. 1825, age 5/10 in 1830. Tradition is he had a son "Jodie", who "came out to Texas, and went back to Ala." There was a Benjamin Franklin Peebles, who for many years was a pilot on an Alabama River Steamboat, who may be this man. Rufus Peoples, b. c. 1825, is said by some to have lived with a married sister, Mrs. Lettie Peoples Whaley, of Dallas, on their farm, near Tehuacana, Freestone Co., Texas. And John W.<sup>7</sup>, b. Aug. 11, 1829, Ga., after father's death, d. 1910, Tex., below.

William<sup>7</sup> Peoples, c. 1814, N.C.--1861, Union Co., Ark., m. c. 1833 in Ga. to Mary Cameron, b. 1806, N.C., dau. of John B. and Bathany Cameron, he b. 1789, N.C., she 1795, Ga. This fam. is found in 1880 census, Falls Co., Tex., and in 1850, Tallapoosa Co., Ala. They had 1 son, John Cameron<sup>8</sup> Peoples, b. 1834 Ga., d. 1911, Corsicana, Tex., and 3 daus., Katharine, b. 1836, Ga., Mary A., b. 1838, Ga., and Sarah, b. 1846, Ala., nfi.

John Cameron<sup>8</sup> Peoples, m. 1st 1854 in Ala. to M.E. Harlan, who d. ante 1860--62. She had 1 son, Henry Wm.<sup>9</sup> Peoples, 1857--6 June, 1935, Waco, Tex. He m. ante 1880 to Cordelia A., b. 1860. nfi. John Cameron<sup>8</sup> m. 2nd. c. 1864-5 to Sarah R. Harlan, sister of his 1st wife, b. 1834, Ala., f. & mo. b. S.C. She had 7 ch.: Artemus A.<sup>9</sup>, b. 1866, and Emma, b. 1869, both in Ark.; Hillery Lee<sup>9</sup>; C. Luther<sup>9</sup>, b. 1876, and J. Knox<sup>9</sup>, 1878, all b. Tex.; and Hattie and Clara.

Hillery Lee<sup>9</sup> Peoples, b. Falls Co., Tex. Sept. 14, 1874, d. Dallas Jan 15, 1939, m. Mar. 3, 1897, Temple, Tex., to Ada Brooks Allen, b. Jan. 13, 1879, Dublin, Tex., dau. of Oliver Henry and Martha Anne (Granade) Allen. They reared 5 ch.: Foster Loraine, b. Aug. 22, 1898, Temple, Texas, m. Nov. 24, 1920, to Dr. Roger W. Gray, m. 2nd. after his death to Robert H. Harper, Sr. She and Dr. Gray had 2 ch.: Lady Jane, b. July 21, 1929, Breckenridge, Tex., m. June 11, 1950, to Roy R. Rushing, they have Randy, Mark, Carol Lynn, Beth Ann, Roy. Foster Lee, b. Oct. 6, 1931, Breckenridge, m. Gwindolyn Bailey, Apr. 24, 1949. They have 2 sons; Roger and David Gray.

Hillery Lee<sup>10</sup>, Jr., b. Nov. 10, 1901, d. Sept. 8, 1924, he then an honor senior at Texas A.&M. Allen Harlan<sup>10</sup>, 3rd ch., b. Sept. 15, 1906, served 4 yrs. as Major in W.W. 2, then with the War Crimes Invest., Washington, D.C. He m. May 24, 1942, to Gertrude Hand of Demopolis, Ala., and have one son, Paul Gregory<sup>11</sup>, age 12. They live Santa Monica, Calif.

Anne Ada, b. Oct. 1909, Dallas, m. Aug. 18, 1931, to Eugene R. Lawson. Ruth Rebecca, the 5th ch., b. Dec. 30, 1912, Dallas, m. Aug. 20, 1935, to Alex Meletio, Jr., and have one son, Alex III.

Mrs. H. L. Peoples and all her daus. belong to the D.A.R., the Huguenot Society of the Founders of Manakin, in Virginia, and other social, civic and business organizations.

Robert W.<sup>7</sup> Peoples, 1817, N.C.--post 1870, probably Elmore Co., Ala., He is found in the 1850 census of Coosa, 1860 of Tallapoosa, and 1870 Elmore
