A. F. Peeples, 80, Hardware Executive, Dies at His Home

Albert Franklin Peeples, 80, president of Peeples Hardware Company, died yesterday at his residence, 720 East 44th street, after a long illness.

He was born at Peeples, S. C., March 7, 1872, the son of Julia Goethe Peeples and Homer H. Peeples, and educated at Lawtonville school.

Mr. Peeples came to Savannah at the age of 15 to attend John Taliaferro's school on Drayton street. He later graduated from Eastman College in Poughkeepsie, N. Y.

He returned to Savannah and was employed by J. D. Weed and Company in the office and as a salesman.

In 1900 he founded Peeples and

Sons with his father. The store was incorporated as Peeples' Hardware Company in 1912.
