bia county, according to the deed, having moved there shortly before. The third child was born in Columbia county. But on account of exposed condition to Indian attacks which had been becoming more and more frequent, he sold out in Columbia county, and moved back to Wayne county, where he continued to live until his death about 1875. Mrs. Pearson died Oct. 9, 1893, and was buried by her husband in the Raulerson Cemetery.

Gen IV PEEPLS, GEORGE ANSON 1820-1890 BERRIEN

Gen 7 George Anson Peeples was born in South Carolina, May 1, 1820, a son of Henry Peeples (Vol.III). He came with his parents to Hall County, Ga., in 1825, and taught school for some years in various counties in North Georgia. In 1850 he was living in Murray County up on the Tennessee line, where he was teaching school. His wife, Martha A. Willis, was born in that part of the state in 1826. They had eleven children:

Soon after the creation of Berrien County in 1856 Mr. Peeples moved there, his parents and others of the family having already moved there several years before. He located at Milltown (now called Lakeland) where he first taught school, then farmed, then engaged in mercantile business awhile. Between 1874 and 1877 Mr. Peeples and family moved to Polk County, Fla., and settled on Whiddon's Creek between Bowling Green and Fort Meade, where he farmed, grew citrus fruits and cattle, and lived until his death Aug. 10, 1890.

The son, Joseph H. Peeples, volunteered Oct. 1, 1861, in Co. "D", 29th Georgia Infantry Regiment, C.S.A., and served until his death of disease at Lauderdale Springs, Miss., Sept. 10, 1863. The son, Wm. H., enlisted in the same company at the same time and served through the war, and was paroled at Thomasville, May. 25, 1865.

PERMENTER, BARVILLE 1796-1866

Barville Permenter was born in South Carolina in son of James Permenter formerly of Edgecombe, N. wife, Frances, was born 1804 in South Carolina; maiden unknown. They had the following children:

This family moved to Ware County, Georgia, from Carolina about 1835, and settled in the 13th land dist that portion which was cut off into Clinch county in 18 into Echols out of Clinch in 1858. Mr. Permenter served the Indian War as a private under Capt. John J. Johnson's Regiment, Florida Militia, June 16th to Dec. 18, 1837. He lived at his home in Echols county in 1866 and was buried in cemetery at Wayfare Church; grave unmarked. He died several years later, making her home during 10 years with their son, James, in Echols county.

The son, Lark Abner Permenter, was born Oct. 1, 1837, according to his obituary published in the Savannah Daily News soon after his death. He enlisted at Stockton, Ga., 1, 1861, in Co. "H", 29th Georgia Infantry Regiment, company was stationed at Savannah engaged in defense when he was taken sick and died of pneumonia in a Savannah hospital, Dec. 2, 1861. His remains were brought home and buried at Wayfare Church; grave marked. He had 1 his Masonic degrees the same year (1861) in Cassia No. 224 at Homerville. At the time of his enlistment he was a store clerk in the store of Cornelius B. Lightsey at Clinch County.

The son, Wright Permenter, enlisted in the same company on May 9, 1862. He served until he was captured near Nashville, Tenn., Dec. 16, 1864. He died of pneumonia in 1865, in the military prison hospital, Louisville, Ky., and was buried there.
