Family histories/genealogies must cite their sources to be considered reliable proof. Lineage and service must be proven by the best possible sources.

We appreciate your interest and that of your Regent, Mrs. Kabrich, in NSDAR membership and we regret that we are not able to verify an ancestor without additional proof and research.

Our genealogists have spent many many hours attempting to establish an ancestor that will qualify under NSDAR requirements. Your first ancestor, offered in 1986, was William Peebles/Peoples. This man has not been proven to have left children and no proof has been located to identify him with your ancestor, Henry Peebles.

John Best of Duplin Co. NC died before July 1799. The Pension cited in your recent collection of proof, identifies the Pensioner as a man who died in Screvin Co. Ga . 11 November 1836. The Pensioner could not have been your ancestor as is clearly outlined in the full Pension on National Archives Microfilm (in the NSDAR Microfilm Center). Finding service for John Best d. 1799 will be difficult as the Scriven Co. GA. man was from the same Dobbs-Duplin area of NC.

Our suggestions for research on the Peebles line is to obtain a copy of The Combined Alphabetical Index from the SC Archives (1430 Senate St., Columbia, SC 29201) for about \$5.00 each name. This index should tell when and where Henry Peebles first owned land. He is surely connected with the Kershaw Co. family and his ancestors must have come from the Brunswick Co. VA area. The ½ brothers of Henry, named Morris, have emerged in Georgia always close to a Peebles relative. It will take the services of a qualified South Carolina researcher to find the link connecting the branches of the Peebles family.

With so much already proven in your lineage, we hope you will continue to research an ancestor for NSDAR membership. The satisfaction of having an unquestioned line to a Revolutionary ancestor is a great achievement. We wish you success in your search and hope to hear from you very soon.

Family histories/genealogies must cite their sources to be considered reliable proof. Lineage and service must be proven by the best possible sources.

We have examined your application and feel that further research and information will be needed. Please note that Georgia Pioneers, Wiregrass is only a collection of family information and was not documented. It is a fine source of clues but we need to have Wills, Deeds, Obituaries, Bible records and other such data in order to verify an application.

The 1850 census would show John Wesley Peoples with his parents. A Will would prove when George A. Peoples died and a tombstone might give full dates for George and wife Martha.

Henry Peoples might appear in the 1850 census with wife, Frances. We need a great deal of information about this generation. The genealogy enclosed with your application gives clues for Henry Peoples but we do not have enough to complete his proof.

William Peoples generation will need a great deal of further research our Fairfield Co. S.C. records do not list him.

In view of the research that will be needed to process your application, we have the following suggestions.

1. Ask you Chapter Officers to write NSDAR Lineage Research Committee

Washington D.C. 20006

Request the help of the Committee in locating proof for this ancestor or in finding another ancestor. This is a service offered to prospective members who have been invited to join a chapter.

2. Offer a substitute ancestor. We will transfer the fee and dues to the other application.

ELIGIBILITY CLAUSE

"Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unflinching loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor, or as a soldier or civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society." (Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

Marriage in every instance means legal and lawful marriage. Date of marriage may be substituted for dates of birth and death where such date proves the soldier to have been living during the Revolution and of a suitable age for service.

The following form of acknowledgement is required:

Applicant further says that the said William Peoples (name of ancestor from whom eligibility is derived) is the ancestor mentioned in the foregoing application, and that the statements hereinbefore set forth are true to the best of her knowledge and belief.

The applicant also pledges allegiance to the United States of America and agrees to support its Constitution. This applies to applicants for membership within the United States of America and its territories.
