Dear Robert,

I've written my friend Christopher about the Court Record you want. And, Mr. Calhoun has sent me his 91 yr. old Cousin's "work sheet" for her application to The Huguenot Society of Virginia.

This, interestingly, gives Jacob Zeigler's wives (pl.) as:

- 1) . . . (unknown) m. 1808 ;
- 2) Ann Daniel Pendarvis m. 1818, b. 6-24-1791 at Barnwell, S.C.

Mr. Calhoun & his Cousin descend from Jacob and Ann Zeigler's son Martin Govan Zeigler. (Mr. Calhoun lives in Charleston.)

I received Mr. Calhoun's letter today.

Yesterday I rec'd mail from Mrs. Julia Hawkes of Tampa, Fla. I have never met Mrs. Hawkes, but was given her name as a descendant of my G³ Grandfather Aquilla Bruton, whose daughter Mary Elizabeth m. Nathaniel Daniel Zeigler.

Mrs. Hawkes gave Jacob Zeigler's wife as Ann Pendarvis.

Back in the 1920 or '30's, my mother's "Cousin" Mallie Woodbury of Quincy & Orlando, Fla. had a Washington, D.C. Genealogist trace her husband's ancestry. I was sent half of the "fan" - the half that pertained to me. It gave Jacob Zeigler's wife as Ann Pendarvis, & her mother as Ann Salley. (It also gave Ann Salley's father as Martin Salley - which I think is an error, but I can't prove it.) (It also gave Ann ^{Salley} Pendarvis' husband as "Brandy" Pendarvis!!!)

Mr. Calhoun's Cousin's application (Hug. Soc. Va.) gives their Huguenot Ancestor as "Michael Piquot (Picot) b. Paris, France; came to America before 1700, bought many acres in Carolina on Santee River. Daughter Martha Piquot (Picot) b. 1750, d. Orangeburg Dist., S.C. 1783⁴, m. Michael Zeigler, etc."

I do wish your earliest letter (14 Nov. 1981) had not been typed in pink ink.

"Mallie" was my mother's
Cousin's wife.

It was difficult to read, and has been fading! I do agree that there seems to have been a generation lost between Michael Picot and Martha; but I am reminded, my paternal Grandmother was b. when her father (Capt. W^m McCall) was 75 years old, and born of his 4th. marriage! (So, who is to say?)

If you think FFS.C. would accept me on the Picot line, I shall gladly accept your Sponsorship, and ask for the application — with many thanks.

I have excellent news on the Hampton "front". I wrote to Virginia G. Meynard, author & compiler of "The Venturers" (re the Hampton family) — giving her the names of my G³ Grandfather William Hampton's children and grandchildren.

She has replied; "The circumstantial evidence is overwhelming that your William Hampton and William Hampton⁵ (in the book) are one and the same. It is my opinion they are the same person."

Because the line is well documented back to William Hampton¹ who came to Virginia in 1620 — this is the least complicated lineage for qualification re FFV. (However, the Hamptons being Saxon, I think the Mallory line best for Magna Charta and the Crown of Charlemagne.)

Re the Picot article: I should think, no one would be offended if I quote Mrs. Dickson's Huguenot Society application re Jacob Zeigler's wives — do you? (Mrs. Dickson is Mr. Calhoun's Cousin, & I should of course credit him also.)
