Dear Rose-Marie,

I was so glad to get your letter yesterday, and find out the "Cone connection". I should put that in the plural, for I can see you and your husband are related several times over to my husband.

We're expecting all of our family here tomorrow to spend the Christmas holidays with us - two sons and their wives, four grandchildren, and the mother-in-law of one of our boys, so you can bet I'm busy cooking and baking today - you're probably doing the same thing!

Couldn't let this go by though, because I have so much to share with you and I'm sure there's lots you can share with me, too. First of all about John Cone/Cone. Yes, if he's the same one, he's definitely an ancestor. The John Cone I found records about in the Bernwell Co. Clerk of Court's Office died in 1824. I thought his wife, Anny Cone, was the mother of his seven (now grown) children, for she was named along with the three sons and four sons-in-law in the deed, or "agreement", which was for all practical purposes a will. (Deed Book O, page 461). I can see now, however, that the reason for such a formal arrangement was probably the fact that Anny was, in fact, not the mother of those children, but was John's second wife. His first wife, then, was most likely your Hannal Platts, who was dead before her father's will was proved in 1816!

My husband's ancestor was one of those three sons, William Cone. The other two sons were John and Andrew, and the four sons-in-law were William Manuel, Joseph H. Hervey, Jno. Ulmer, and Theophilus Sauls. I think that Hervey's wife was Catherine Cone, and Manuel's wife was Affy (?) Cone. William was born in 1791, Andrew in 1797 and Catherine in 1799. The other birth-dates I don't have, but I think John was the oldest, at least of the boys.

William Cone was the father of William H. Cone, Scotty's great-grandfather, and he was also the father of Harriet Cone, who married Nick Williams. (Somehow I have her listed as Harriet "G." Cone.) By the way, I guess you know Nick later married Mary Elizabeth Barnes, who is the one evidently buried next to Harriet in the Cone Cemetery in Lyncamore. Nick himself, I hear, is buried at Hickory Grove. Did he marry a third time? By the way, Mary E. Barnes was the niece of Eveline Barnes who married William H. Cone.

I have lots more information on all of these, but must stop now. Please let me know if you think we're both talking about the same Cones - I'd love to find for sure that William's mother was Hannah Platts!

I'll enclose a Family Group Sheet for William Cone and his wife, Elizabeth Creech. And let's get together one day in January - maybe we can meet at Yoder's for lunch - and swap some information. I'll be anxious to hear from you. Please give our very best wishes to your Mother. The Lord works in strange ways!
