GEORGE RHODES, Signer of the Ordinance of Secession.

FAMILY BACKGROUND:

Thomas Rhodes, father of the subject of this paper, was born 22 Apptil 1775 at Bridgnorth, Shropshire, England, oldestason of George Rhodes and Elizabeth Bache who were married at the Church of St. Mary Magdalene, Bridgnorth on Il Nov. 1772. Thomas came to South Carolina after 1790 to join his uncle, John Rhodes, who was born in Bridgnorth, England 2 Feb. 1747, came to South Carolina where on Il June 1774 he was married by the Rev. Mr. Moreau in St. Helena's Church, Beaufort to Mary Talbird (21 Sept. 1751 - 19 Oct. 1811), dau. of Henry Talbird (Talbot) of Beaufort. John Rhodes was the father of John Rhodes, born 3 Jan. 1777; Dr. Nathaniel Henry Rhodes (2 Feb. 1783 - 10 July 1817) who married Mary Hamilton, be Rhodes married as her second husband on 9 Dec. 1819 Dr. Richard B. Screven); Henrietta Rhodes (24 June 1790 - 26 March 1852) married (1) Paul Hamilton by whom she had a dau. Mary Rhodes Hamilton b. 13 Jan. 1811, married (2) Rev. William Taylor Potter, by whom she had a dau. Henrietta Rhodes Potter, died 11 Feb. 1834; Mary Rhodes, born 28 Jan. 1793.

On 10 July 1795 Thomas Rhodes married in St. Philip's Church, Charleston, Mary Wright, dau. of the late John Wright of Charleston, She died after having two children: Thomas Wright Rhodes, Who married Elizabeth Phoebe Jenkins, dau. of Col. John Jenkins (born 1772) and

Sarah Phoebe Chaplin; and Sara Rhodes who married a Fripp.

The second wife of Thomas Rhodes was Mary Cater (25 June 1776 - 25 Feb. 1823), dau. of Thomas Cater, born 1751, son of Thomas Cater and Susannah Baker (6 Apr. 1731 - 8 Jan. 1752, dau. of Richard Baker, 1703- 31 May 1752 and Mary Bohun, 1700-1736, dau. of Nicholas Bohun, 1680- 1718 (son of Edmund Bohun, Chief Justice of South Carolina) and his wife, Margaret, dau. of the 1st Landgrave Edmund Bellinger. The mother of Mary Cater was Rachel Miles (1755-1802), granddaughter of the famous Indian Fighter, Capt. James MacPherson of the Rangers, who was born in South Carolina in 1668, dying 6 Mar. 1771, who escorted Gen. James Oglethorpe from Beaufort to found Savannah and the Colony of Georgia in 1733.

* Thomas Rhodes died 25 April 1809, leaving three children by his second wife, Mary Cater, who afterwards married Rev. Winborn Asa Lawton.

GEORGE RHODES was born on Calliwashe Island, South Carolina Il Jan. 1802.

After the death of his father on 25 April 1809 he was sent by his mother to her cousin, Elizabeth Mary MacPherson (Mrs. James Reid Pringle) of Charleston, dau. of Gen. John MacPherson and Susan Miles. Mrs. Pringle sent him to the famous school of Dr. Moses Waddell at Willington, attended by John C. Calhoun, Gen. Longstreet and others.

On 15 Nov. 1821 he married THURSA EVELINA ROBERT (4 Sept. 1803-1828); after the death of Thursa Evelina, George married her younger sister, ELIZA JANE ROBERT (30 Jan. 1810-1867). His wives were daughters of the Rev. James Jehu Robert (4 Nov. 1781 - 19 Jan. 1852), son of John Robert of Robertville (b. Santee, S.C. July 1742, d. Robertville 24 Feb. 1826)

and Elizabeth Dixon (7 June 1750 - 15 Nov. 1820), dau. of Capt. Thomas Dixon of James Island and Elizabeth Smith (6 Jan. 1722 - 26 Sept. 1756), dau. of the Second Landgrave Thomas Smith (1668-9 May 1738), son of Landgrave Thomas Smith, Governor of Carolina 1693-94.
