That she had known Miss Carrie & Mr. Maner, I said I gues we were related also & she laughed. You stated that Sarah Jaudon Robert died across the road, east or south?

Is there a copy of the paper available about the tragic death of Isabelle Robert & Richard Bostic, prepared by Michael West Berry. Would be ever so grateful for a copy. This could be printed and sold at the Reunion. I'm so grateful for your knowledge and smart brain that remembers all of the facts. We are so blessed to have you with your interest and concerns.

I keep all of your letters and refer to them at times. Who knows some day I may publish a book, "LettersfromCoz. Robert". I agree with you placing stones for Rev.
