RICHARD CLARKE landed at Phila. Pa. in 1733. It is thought that M. MARGARET (thought to be Calhoun or Caldwell) they came over at the same time that John C. Calhoun ancestors came. They migrated to Virginia, then set out from Va. sometime prior to 1760. In Feb. 1760 they left Abbeville for Augusta, Ga. and 23 persons were massacred by the Indians. Richard and Margaret and six others were buried in the same grave, out in the woods where they died. Three of their children JOHN CLARKE 1-12, Sarah 10, and Margaret 8, had been sent out to pick service berries and were not killed.
