There was only 1 more, that I have seen: Elysee Robert, 1656, Nyon, Vaud, Suisse; U of Lausanne; perhaps a bro to Rev. P.??? I am assuming this translates into Elias.

Just out of London, S-W there was an old Robert Family, & I have NOt been able to follow them on down a bit.

In London I think there was another Robert Family: Merchants I think their/his dau m Poinsetta as Roberts.

It looks as if: Elias Robert, s of Rev. P. & Jeanne Braye, was around London from at least 1699-1709, where he was Naturalized, & it depends on who you believe but the p-c of the Original Copy by Hand, sent to HSSC, 8 Anne - 1709 prob March PRO: L KB 24/2 PTI----1P643. Elias signs. (Kings Bench Oath) Others: Jean Laurens, Germand, Maillard, Du puy, Metcalf, (3), Godart, Mark of Magn. de Lude?, and it seems the names are almost all French.

Somehow, & I can not remember exactly why, but I think he Elias, s of Rev. P. Robert, M in London, or England, and NOT a French-Suisse born.

Anyhow, by the 16 June 1709 he was in S. C. with wife & ? children, when Rev. P. Robert was Issued a 500Acre Land Warrent, next to Benj. Godine. Equals---10 heads: Jean-Wf 3 children, or 4. If 4 -6 T, then E. -wf 1, plus dau.
