Dear Robert:

Many thanks for yours of 4 March, & I did NOT intend to provoke a bunch of correspondence, but just remind y'all some of Rev. P. Robert, Robert, Roberts descendents are still doing "a little".
(Rhubart-Robart-Roubaix etc)

In re-reading mine of 2/27, Capt. Peter Robert, b 15 January 1758, another ERROR shows up. With my eyes & glasses, almost can NOT even hit the nail head, with a hammer, anymore. The date 5/Jan/'58 belongs to the LINE above, pc of "Mgs. & D 1763-1820 Ga. NEWS PAPERS", by Warren, Mary B., pg 97, run here in "Monroe" 4/81.

The LINE above refers to Mrs Mary Robert, wife of Elias R. DS. His D is in next Volumn (II) 1820- Elias Robert, 71y 7 mo, d 6/13/1828 @ res of Elias G. Jaudon, Black Swamp, S. C. For 23 years a respectable citizen/inhabitant of Savannah, Ga. A good CHRISTIAM man. left 4 children. (Naturally, I did not have in 1971, & AGAIN I think an ERROR was made: The Elias in Thomas County 1830-1850, which I published, was the s of Thomas & _____. I hope these can be CORRECTED, soon. (Im still spelling Rue -Roux, very much like the Texaco Man -Bunkie, La. 1943---Goux,)

It is my desire/hope to "PUBLISH" -JEAN ROBERT, in book form, with 1-2-3 Chapters preeeeding Jean: Rev. P., Daniel, Wm., Wm, on back to Sir William Robert, est at 1300 (1285-1300 to Wales with K-Edw I), and some more on P-III descendents, most with "S", along with bringing our direct Family --ABRAHAM ROBERT s II 1745-NOW 1820+---on down to about 1980. (I have 2 more g-daus, 3 g-sons).

NOTE: MY NEW CHART 3/83 Jean Robert, dau M Lineroux, Peter Lineroux, & Maryanne (Mariah Ann) Noah Thomas (Serre g-fath), John Peter Thomas. In Screven Ga. c 1811+29 there is ref to Jonah Peter Roberts & Liberty, Ga. about 1795 there is Wm. & Jonah ROBERTS. Most certainly these come from P-III, Fr. Santee, after Lunacy of Peter Robert, Jan 1765, his son: Jonah ---Not Jonah R. DS-d 1775 who m Mary Roberts Sanders-- P-IV d 1775; (P-III d 1741); P-V, bros Jonah, Thomas, William scattered away from Fr. Santee. Thos is thought to have been Ship Capt. for Capt. Benj. Robert s d 1772, & other than the notes above, my files do NOT have an awful lot of POSTIVE DATA on them.

Thos. ROBERT (Reuben middle name) O/burg Church Records, Land Grant (est b 1733 & d 1784-87 Edgfield - Will) 1756 200A is "S", most others & son Thos is ROBERT. (sons Thos & John served Rev. War in Ga. as ROBERT.

So-----Most probably the Beaufort Reuben Roberts, Esq later on c 1810?, or so, was correct: He was a ROBERT.

Elias Robert, s of Rev. P. bbetwn 1675-82, Naturalized London Jan 1709, in South Carolina by June 1709 (Rev. P. Robert Land Grant @ 50 Acres per Family, 500A = 10 Family Members = Jean, Wf., & 2-4 children bb 1701-1709; Elias & wf. just arrived fm London, maybe with 1-2 children, & dau Mary-Marie (une fille who arrived with Jean) with perhaps her husb. & 1 child, or just herself. M-1 Wingate M-2 Hay-Hays-Hayes.

Most probably you will find Elias Robert Robarts in 1756 Muster Roll 6th Company, Chilhaw Dist., St. Bartholomew's Parish. Hhos Hutchinson, Capt. (Hester/Ester Robert, dau P-III M _____ Hutchinson & they lived Colleton). page 237 S.C.H.M. 70:237 (1969) -----Listed as: Robert Robarts.

Rev. P. Robert may have had another son: Samuel Benj., or one Natz. London at same time as Elias R. "was of the same Family".

The other 50A June 1709, was probably for P-III b 1702, and in all of the Excitement, Joy, with others arriving, overlooked until later on in the day.-----So much to do, so much attention after all those years!

Perhaps, "one of these days", Foreign Data will show up to confirm &/or disprove these assumptions.

Rev. Wm. Hen Robert, was it about 1900, wrote "Originally from Wales," 3 sons: "P-II & Descendents were to remain ROBERT, John----ROBART/s--- Elias----ROBERTS." Until something comes along, I will have to accept his statement, perhaps not Miller & Stafford, but his I do!

1685 to 1707 for Jean/John & 1709 for Elias, is a long time, even with Letters, I am almost postive were written, Daniel R., est 1698-1700, (Was Elias carrying the Inventory, or Jean?)(Most probably Gold)

It was good hearing from you & my condolence re the D in yours 4 Mar. The mail brought copies of Cuzan Flora & Athelea R's application to H.S. of S.C. 2 more may help some!
