

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

The father died in Madison County, and in 1833 the widow, with her sons James and George W., joined the settlement in Big Lick Township, locating in Section 14. John Graham served twenty-four consecutive years as justice of the peace, and six as commissioner of Hancock County. He died in Findlay in the fall of 1885. George W. died upon the old homestead, and James in Minnesota, whither he had removed.

Baldsworth and Mary Baringer came about the same time as the Grahams. They were natives of Germany, and immigrated to Maryland, thence came west to Stark County, Ohio, in 1823 or 1824, and some eight years afterward settled in the southeast quarter of Section 2, Big Lick Township, entered May 22, 1833, where both resided till their death. They had a family of ten children. Joseph, the eldest son, now occupies the old home-

stead, and is one of the substantial farmers of the township.

An the fall of 1833 two pioneers came here together and put up cabins in the forest of Big Lick. These men were William Roller and his son-in-law, John Moore. Both were natives of Pennsylvania, and came to Hancock from Richland (now Ashland) County, Ohio. Mr. Roller erected his cabin on Section 15, and, in the spring of 1834, brought out his family, consisting of his wife. Nancy, and eight children. Soon after coming to Big Lick he was elected justice of the peace, and the General Assembly of 1836 appointed him associate judge of Hancock County, which position he held thirteen years. He entered 1,120 acres of land in the fall of 1833, most of which was inherited by his children; he and his wife died in this township. Of their children, Michael, the eldest son, resides on Section 7, and two of the daughters. Mrs. John Moore and Mrs. Moses McAnelly, are also living in the township. Mr. Roller won and retained many friends during his residence in the county.

John Moore built his cabin in the northwest quarter of Section 15, now the farm of his son-in-law A. J. Moore. He married Agnes W. Roller in the fall of 1833, and removed to this township the following spring. Their first-born, Nancy, the wife of A. J. Moore, was rocked in a sugar trough, which Mr. Moore says was made by the Wyandot chief Big River. For more than half a century Mr. Moore and his wife have borne the trials and burdens of life together. They reared a family of ten children, all of whom are living in Hancock County, and seven in the vicinity of the old homestead, only one now remaining at home. Mr. Moore purchased his present farm of John Huff, in 1866, who removed to Missouri. He is one of the substantial pioneer farmers of Big Lick, where he settled over fifty years ago, comparatively penniless. Few men of his times can point to a more honorable life than this successful old settler, who is highly respected by

young and old throughout this portion of the county.

Jesse Wiseley, a native of Fairfield County, Ohio, built his cabin on the southeast quarter of Section 7, in 1835. Mr. Wiseley brought with him his wife, Keziah, and son, John, and thus began life in the wildneress. He claims to have erected the first frame house in the township, which is yet standing. Mr. Wiseley has lived upon the same farm since coming to the county.

Henry and Jane Thomas, natives of Irelaud, immigrated to Virginia, in 1816, thence removed to Pennsylvania, and about 1827, to Wayne County, Ohio. In October, 1833, Mr. Thomas entered 320 acres of land in the

north part of Big Lick in Sections 5 and 9, upon which they located in 1835. They reared a large family, two sons, Henry and Samuel L. being still residents of the township, where the parents spent the balance of their

Moses McAnelly was one of the most prominent citizens of Hancock County up to his death in 1852. He married Mary, daughter of William Roller, and in 1836-37 settled in the northeast quarter of Section 17. Mr. McAnelly possessed a good education and considerable force of character, and soon took a leading place in public affairs. He served four successive terms as justice of the peace, and in 1839 was elected to the Legislature and re-elected in 1840, and elected to the State Senate in 1842, serving with honor in each body. Mr. McAnelly was a pioneer school teacher and a local politician of considerable influence, and a man of upright character and unswerving integrity. His widow and some of the children are residing upon the old homestead in Big Lick.

Among other settlers of this period were John P. Ebersole, Jacob Barger, William and Henry Deibly, Charles Henderson, James Wright, Robert L. Martin, William Wilson, Uriah E. Drake, Jackson Stall, Leonard Baumgartner, Samuel B., Silas, William K. and Abner Leonard, William Brown, John Sheridan, John A. Metzger, James Ruckman and Richard Bayliss, all of whom came between 1835 and 1838. Some of these are long since dead, while others are yet residing in the township, and among its

worthy citizens.

Justices of the Peace.—The following citizens have filled the office of justice in Big Lick Township, some of them serving several terms: Amos Dunken, Levi Poulson, William Roller, James Wright, Robert L. Martin, William Wilson, Leonard Baumgartner, Moses McAnelly, Charles Henderson, John Graham, Jeremiah Ricketts, Vames Ruckman Frederick Roamer, J. P. Edwards, Abraham Mumma, William K. Leonard, George W. Graham, J. W. Gibson, John Newhouse, George W. Brown, David E. Neely,

Andrew J. Moore and A. M. Jacobs.

Schools.—Five years after the organization of the township, the first log schoolhouse was erected in Section 14, on the farm of George W. Graham, Sr. Here most of the school youth were taught for a few years. The Rollers, Moores, Martins, Hendersons, Grahams, Wilsons, Leonards and others attended this school. The second school building, also a log structure, was erected in Section 8, on the land now owned by J. D. Ewing. The Thomases, Wiseleys, McAnellys and other families of the neighborhood sent children to this school. Among the first teachers of Big Lick, we find the names of Moses McAnelly, Susan Roller, Robert L. Martin and William K. Leonard. With the growth in population the number of schoolhouses also increased, and better buildings began to make their appearance, until to-day the township contains ten good schoolhouses, which are in full operation throughout the school year.

Churches.—The Methodist Episcopal denomination organized a class at the house of Leonard Baumgartner, in Section 29, as early as 1837–38. The Robertses, Baumgartners and Bakers were perhaps its principal members, and Rev. Thomas Thompson was the minister who accomplished the good work. Some of its members lived in Marion Township, and after several years a frame building was put up on the farm of Jacob Baker in Section 24 of that subdivision. In the course of time the society became extinct, and

Willis Lloyd Beardsley, second child of Henry Curtis and Elizabeth (Smith) Beardsley, was born in Ellsworth Township sixty-five years ago, and has lived in it practically ever since. His life-work has been agriculture. In his boyhood he was given adequate schooling, and thereafter assisted his father in the operation of the ancestral estate during the life of his father, at whose death he inherited a portion of his father, at whose death he inherited a portion of the farm of his grandfather. He owns about 100 of the farm of his grandfather. He owns about 100 acres of his father's farm, and in early manhood farmed a much larger acreage. He associated with his father interestedly in the raising and exhibiting of Merino sheep, but latterly his farming has been mainly of dairying character. He maintains a large herd of good Jersey cows, about twenty-five head, and latterly has been ably assisted by his son Earl. He has not followed politics with particular keenness, otherwise in all probability he might have had office in the local administration. for he is generally office in the local administration, for he is generally well regarded in the township. He is identified with the Grange and the Farm Bureau, in both of which agricultural organizations he takes an active interest. Religiously he is a member of the Presbyterian Church.

CHARLES J. ROLLER As noted here and elsewhere, the Roller family has been established in Green Township of Mahoning County since the first years of the nineteenth century. There have been able men and home making and home loving women in every one of the four or five generations who have lived here. A distinction of particular interest attaching to Charles J. Roller of Greenford and his father, the late Samuel W. Roller, is due to their pioneer and successful efforts in horticulture. Samuel W. Roller probably planted, against the advice and in spite of the ridicule of his neighbors, the first commercial apple orchard in this part of the Mahoning Valley, and persisting against trials and discouragements he lived to see his plans and his faith justified, and the work he instituted has been carried on by his son Charles J. Roller, who has made a name for himself in horticultural circles. It is said that the Roller family originated in the kingdom of Wuertemberg, Germany, where, as showing they were people of the higher class, they enjoyed the possession of a coat of arms. From that region John Roller immigrated to the American colonies in 1740 and established a home in the Sinking Valley of Pennsylvania, near Alexandria. 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sylvania. He had seven sons who fought as soldiers in some phases of the Revolutionary war. One of them. Jacob, was killed by the Indians on his farm after peace had been declared between the Colonies and Great Britain, though the Indians were still at large. One of these sons of the original settler was John, who with three brothers after the Revolution moved to the Tennessee country. They did not like the institution of slavery, and John and one of his brothers leaving Tennessee came to Eastern Ohio in 1802 and thus began the family history in Green Township. John Roller settled a mile and a half northeast of the old Washingtonville community. Washingtonville at one time was an important trade center, situated on the line between Columbiana and Mahoning counties. John Roller lived there until his death in 1819, and was buried at Washingtonville. His son Isaac Roller was the first white child born in Green Township. This Isaac became a tanner and lived to old age and died at Limaville.

Another son of John was Michael Roller, who on May 1, 1827, established his home on land now included in the fruit farm of his grandson, Charles J. Roller. He lived out his life there, dying about 1800, at the age of sixty, and was buried at Greenford. His wife was Isabelle Calvin, who lived to the age

of eighty.

An attractive landmark in that section, and the home of Charles J. Roller, is a brick house that was built by Michael in 1836. Michael had a great deal of skill as a mason, and the brick for this house he burned on his own land and laid up the walls so true that they have stood eighty-four years. He also built the present barn on the farm about 1852. old house is still in an excellent state of preservation. Michael worked at his trade in Salem, seven miles away, and some of the houses he built are still standing there. The children of Michael Roller were two, Samuel W. and Rebecca. The latter became the wife of Richard Templin, and lived threequarters of a mile west of Greenford, where Rebecca died when past eighty years of age and where her daughter Belle, Mrs. Edward Calvin, now lives.

Samuel W. Roller was born April 30, 1826, and was about a year old when his parents moved to the farm just described. He also owned another tract of 176 acres, part of which is now the home of his son Ernest. Samuel W. Roller for many years pursued general farming and stock raising. He made his first venture as a commercial horticulturist when he blocked out about twenty acres in 1888 and set it to apple trees, selecting three or four staple varieties. He kept adding to his orchard until he had thirty acres bearing fruit, comprising the largest individual orchard in the county. This immediate section of Green Township is the most important fruit growing part of the Mahoning Valley. Conditions seem admirable for that purpose, soil, elevation, drainage and other factors measuring well up to the standards set by horticulturists. The land lies about 1,200 feet above sea level, and a crop of apples is almost certain.

WILLIAM FORD BOWEN in 1919 was elected city treasurer of Warren, taking up the duties of that office January 1, 1920. Mr. Bowen is especially well qualified for this public office by reason of his favorable experience as a Warren banker. He is assistant secretary and treasurer of the Union Savings & Trust

Company at Warren.

The Bowen family and their connections have long been identified with Northeastern Ohio, particularly Trumbull County. His great-grandfather Harris Bowen came from New England and was identified with pioneer people and things in Greene Township of Trumbull County. His son Rhuel Bowen was born in New England but grew up in Ohio, and married Malinda Cone. She was a native of Connecticut. Her father, Sylvester Cone, was an early settler in Greene Township of Trumbull County, but in 1861 went to the far Northwest, Minnesota, and died in that state. Sylvester H. Bowen, father of City Treasurer Bowen, was born on a farm in Greene Township February 16, 1857, and is now living retired at Warren. For over forty years he was a black-smith in Trumbull and Ashtabula counties, and from 1906 operated a shop of his own at Warren until 1915. He has been identified with the Odd Fellows fraternity for thirty-six years. Sylvester H. Bowen married Estella Bingham, who was born at Orwell, Ashtabula County, daughter of Benjamin Bingham, a native of Vermont and an early settler of Ashtabula County. Mrs. Estella Bowen died at Warren August 5, 1918.

William Ford Bowen was born July 9, 1886, while his parents were residents of Colebrook in Ashtabula County. He acquired his early education in the schools of North Bloomfield Township, graduated from the Warren Business College in 1906, and the following year became bookkeeper for the People's Ice Company in Warren. He has been in the Union Savings & Trust Company since January 27, 1910, beginning as bookkeeper, soon afterward was promoted to the duties of teller, and since July, 1918, has been assistant secretary and treasurer of the in-

stitution.

Mr. Bowen is a member of the Warren Board of Trade, of Mahoning Lodge No. 29 of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows and of Old Erie Lodge No. 3, Free and Accepted Masons. He married Edna E.

Smith, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Smith of Sharpsville, Pennsylvania. They have one son, George William.

GEORGE TOD, JR., was a nephew of Governor Da. vid Tod and a grandson of the George Tod who established his home at Youngstown in 1801. A general outline of the Tod family relationship is given on other pages

The late George Tod, Jr., who made his home at Youngstown many years, was particularly constant one as a railroad builder. He was one of the hading railroad construction engineers in the country.

He was born at Ottawa in Wankesha County, Wisconsin, in 1855, and spent his boyhood day Wisconsin. He came to Youngstown as a yeing man, and lived there until his death on December He came to Youngstown as a yeing 1014, with the exception of eleven years spent in California.

His notable career as a railroad builder can be inferred from the following facts: He built the P. C. & T. Railroad between Youngstown and Akron; had charge of the location and construction of the Western Division of the Union Pacific Pal road through the states of Oregon and Washington, built and located the Los Angeles and Reduid, Beach Railroad in California; designed and laid one the towns of Inglewood and Redondo Beach, Canada and Redondo Beach and Redondo Bea fornia; and laid out part of the town of Sana Monica, California. He also built several strorailway lines, including the Youngstown and Sharon and Newcastle, Sharon and Middlesex and Sharon and Shar Sharon and Sharpsville, He was also builder of the Youngstown & Southern Railway.

His business genius was best exemplified in the varied undertakings. Outside of business his chief interest was in his home and church, and he nevefilled a public office, though a staunch republican political belief. He was the first president of the board of trustees of the Richard Brown Memoria. Chapel at Youngstown, and held that post until he resigned in 1912. He was a member of the Trinity

Church and one of its trustees.
