## HISTORY

History of Rollersville- Golden Anniversary of Rollersville School. 10 June 1956 (From a booklet published commemorating (the event))

Rollersville came into being prior to 1835. It was laid out and surveyed partly by Henry Roller, Wilson Teeters, William Whitford, and Luther Chase. It was named Rollersville after Henry Roller.

Henry Roller was the son of Jacob Roller who was a native of Wurtemberg (WÜRTTEMBERG), Germany. He was born of poor parents, but through established ancestry, the family enjoyed the distinction of a coat of Arms. He came to America about 1740. He worked for a farmer three years to pay his passage across the Atlantic. Soon after this he married Miss Mary Hammer, who was also from Wurtemberg, Germany. They became the parents seven sons and two daughters. Three of the sons were enrolled in the Continental Army of 1776- Jacob, Philip, and Balser. In the year of 1812, Henry, son of John Roller, served as a soldier under General Harrison. He came from Columbiana County to Scott Township in 1832, and lived in the township until his death, 5 May 1850. He lived in a log house on the Bank of Sugar Creek a short distance below the house which stands on what is known as the Stitt, Poole, and Sager Place, now belonging to Harold Goetz. Henry Roller's wife was a Miss Teeters. Children of this union were Jane ( first wife of Dr. J. C. Thomson), Elisha Roller, Katherine (Van Horn), John Roller, Mary (Clary), Susan (Brakefield) and Shadrack B. Roller, Henry Roller, For whom Rollersville is named is buried in Bradner Cemetery in Roller Row.

Allen, arriving in 1831, was the first settler in Madison Township and built the first house on what was later known as the King farm.

Jacob Plantz was the fifth pioneer to come to Rollersville and John Houtz was the sixth.

The early pioneers were mostly farmers from eastern Ohio, Pennsylvania, New York, and New England.

The Roller families now living around Dunbridge, Scotch Ridge, and Arcadia are evidently descendants of relatives of the Henry Roller for whom Rollersville was named since they have also traced their ancestry to a Jacob Roller of Wurtemberg, Germany.

The last previous generation of Rollers consisted of William, George, Sis (Sarah) (Spahr), Philena (Huffman), Henry, and Lorena (Vickers)! (No mention is made of Mary Ann and Ida (Taylor) also sired by Michael (Elizabeth Swindler) Roller of Hancock County),

William had seven children- James and Elizabeth, deceased, Florence (Main), and Jay C., of Scotch Ridge, Mary (Garrow) of Fulton County, Michael and William, living near Dunbridge.

The children of George Roller are still living around Arcadia.

Willie Roller, grandson of James Roller and son of James Raymond Roller, designed the hair-do for Grace Kelley and for two of her attendants. He was flown to Monaco for the wedding festivities.

In the little old cemetery one-half miles south of Rollersville, on the original Teeters farm, some of the names are Teeters, Smith, Lyman, and Woolcott.

The Yeasting farm was once the Kornbaum place and originally belonged to the Rollers.

Jacob Plantz gave land for the first cemetery, Chestnut Hill.

on what is now the County Line, east of Bradner. He and his three sons built the log church there.

During Civil War times Rollersville was a hot-bed of Southern sympathizers. Captain Eaton organized a company that drilled nights in the square by the light of a bonfire. Dr. Thompson was the company doctor. Since most of the men could not tell right from left, straw was placed in one boot and hay in the other. When learning to drill, the captain gave the command, "Hay foot, straw foot".

Many of the oil people came from the original oil field, Titusville, PA.

Dawsey's oil well, north and east of the square paid for itself even when oil was 13 cents a barrel.

The Marshall sisters, descendants of Henry Roller, who used to visit George Holcomb and his mother, are still living in Toledo.

We know that many tears were shed but with all the tears there must have been a great sense of joy and love that they shared when thinking of their parents and their influence on the family. Now the property has been sold to Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Abke and family of Pemberville.

Mr. and Mrs. Roller and family came to Scotch Ridge while their children were quite young and surely were a great asset to the community. Mr. Roller was janitor at the Webster School until he was no longer able to do the work. He served as janitor but as one who had children in school, appreciated his very great concern for every child and many a time, if he saw him or her doing something he felt he or she should not he would, in a kindly way, drop in a word and try to make them see why it was best not to do the thing. He was known to all the children affectionately as "Jay!"

Never was there a home (to my knowledge) where there was so much respect and concern for each other. Also there was always room for others. They were closely knit to the Scotch Ridge Church for many years. Mrs. Roller was a much loved Sunday School teacher. We knew the Rollers felt very rich (not in money) when they viewed the results of their labors and many years together. Their eldest daughter Zelma was a teacher in Virginia until her marriage to Mr. Ferne Marshall; Mr. Hampton Roller attended Electrical School and worked for the Penn-Central railroad until his retirement last year. Irene (Mrs. Nelson Liedel) graduated from business college and is a secretary; Bernice graduated from Toledo Hospital School of Nursing and is married to Dr. Jack Lunderman; Dr. Paul Roller is an Anesthetists at Dayton, OH with Dr Lunderman; Mary V. (Mrs. Stanley Eberhart) graduated from Beauty College and is employed in "Cosmetics" at LaSalle and Koch's, Toledo.

## FAMILY HISTORY NOTES, EXCERPTS, RECOLLECTIONS

### A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY PERTAINING TO WILLIAM AND MARTHA ROLLER

William and Martha Ruckman Roller of Biglick Township, Hancock County, Ohio were married at West Independence, Ohio on the 26th March 1871. Shortly thereafter they journeyed north to Wood County, Ohio by wagon settling on a ninety acre tract of land which he and his father Michael had purchased the fall before. This tract is situated in the northeast corner of Middleton Township, then known as Belleville Ridge. There had been about six acres cleared on this tract prior to their arrival. The buildings consisted of a log house and barn. Grandfather was handy with the ax. Each winter he would clear about three or four acres of timber and then prepare it for planting of crops.

For several winters he hauled ship timber from the surrounding area into Perrysburg at the river front. There it was lashed together and towed to Sandusky and Lorraine, Ohio and used in the building of lake ships. He also helped grade on the old Toledo and Ohio Central Railroad when it was put through. He received no pay for his team and labor because the stock holders went bankrupt at pay time.

In later years when his sons grew up he purchased twenty acres east of the intersection of the Dowling road and McCutchinville pike<sup>①</sup> better known today as U. S. 23. They cleared the twenty acres of timber and put it under cultivation. They later sold it and purchased an eighty acre tract south on the Carter road which is owned today by a son Michael.

Grandfather was active in local affairs and a lover of politics. He served on various local boards and also served two terms as Wood County Commissioner around the years 1908 and 1911. He and Grandmother were faithful workers in the church, attending regularly and seeing ~~and seeing~~ that the children were brought up in a <sup>Christain</sup> like home. They were Methodists.

## FAMILY HISTORY NOTES, EXCERPTS, RECOLLECTIONS

In later years he turned the farming of the home place over to his son William.

Grandfather passed away in September, 1928 and Grandmother in the year 1931 in July. Both are buried in the New Belleville Ridge Cemetary, a short distance from where they lived out a long, happy and useful life.

The above history was gained by talking and associating with my Grandparents while I lived with them in the years of 1917-1918 and from 1922 until their death.

Thelma Ross Fox submitted the following article which she found in the family archives written in 1897 on tablet paper yellowed with age.

1897 Record.

Joseph Hampton, who during his life was a resident of Plain township, was born in Ross County, OHIO, November 25, 1825 and died March 26, 1895. He was married November 16, 1847, to Miss Eliza Jane Wilson, who was born in Mercer County, Penn., on December 18, 1829, and after their marriage, settled (in the fall of 1848) on the farm his widow now owns and occupies.

Mr. Hampton was a carpenter by trade, and during the earlier years of his life followed that occupation. Ill health, however, compelled him to give up steady work and he removed to the farm where he carried on contracting until the infirmities of increasing age forced him to abandon all labor.

He was a kind husband and father, a good neighbor and a loyal citizen. In politics, he was a Democrat. He was a Christian and a firm believer in the Bible.

To Mr. and Mrs. <sup>Hampton</sup> seven children were born as follows: Warren W. born May 29, 1850 is postmaster at Dunbridge, Wood County; he married Miss Malinda Jackson and they had five children- Maude, Bernice, James, Pearl and Cora Viola, born 23 July and died September 11, 1891; Cynthia, born November 5, 1851, is the wife of Adelbert Seger, and live in Dunbridge, Ohio. They have seven children, namely: Electa (wife of Joseph Kelley) and has two children (May and Everett), Joseph, Frank, Edna, Arthur, Lenora and Alva.; Cassius A., born May 20, 1853, Married Ella Perrin and has three sons: Edgar, Percy and Donald. He is a merchant at Perrysburg, Ohio. John C. born June 26, 1856, is an engineer on the Baltimore and Ohio railroad and resides at Garrett, Ind. He married Ada Budd and they have two children, Wade and Mildred.

Emma, born October 7, 1865, is the wife of J. D. Killyen (Ross) and they reside with her mother on the home farm

### ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

Jacob Roller Sr., captured Tories as they occupied a cabin in Canoe Valley, Pa., after passing Brush Mountains. Tories left their rifles outside the cabin, entering it in search of food, found nothing but a pot of boiled mush and some lard. While engaged in appeasing their appetites Samuel Moore and his companion, Jacob Roller Sr., who were on a hunting expedition, saw the rifles and immediately secured them. When Mr. Moore walked in with his gun cocked and called upon the Tories to surrender, the order was cheerfully complied with, and they were marched to Holiday Fort. On the way thither one of them became insolent and informed Moore and his companion that in a short time they would repent arresting them. Heller being an athletic man, when they arrived at the fort, he fixed a rope to the Tory's neck, and hove it over a beam and drew him up. Moore persuaded his companion to desist. They were afterwards taken to Bedford. From Jones History of Juniata Valley, Pa. p256

A History of the Roller Family prepared by the late Dr. J.R. Hewitt of Sharon, Pa., also mentions Jacob Heller Sr., as having built the Fort in Sinking Valley, Pa., in 1777, where he lived, giving protection to his people and recruiting soldiers for the Services against the British.

The said Jacob Roller Sr.

is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Patriot while maintaining a fort in Sinking Valley, Pennsylvania from 1777 to 1781

## EXPERTS WILL GIVE LESSONS IN CANNING

COUNTY AGENT TO ARRANGE FOR DEMONSTRATIONS.

First to be Held at Shawtown School—Others to be Dated as Soon as Possible—Domestic Science Experts to Instruct.

County Agent E. M. Rowe has arranged for a home canning demonstration at the Shawtown school house next week and he expects to arrange for others if interest is shown by Hancock county housewives.

The domestic science demonstrations are given by experts from Ohio State University and require about two hours.

Most of the equipment is brought by the woman who makes the demonstration, and it will be necessary for the parties having the demonstration to furnish the following:

- 1 2-burner oil stove in good condition
- 1 50 pound lard can
- 1 tea kettle
- 1 pint fruit jars with good lids
- 1 or 2 kinds of fruit (enough to fill one pint jar)
- 1 or 2 kinds of vegetables (enough to fill one pint jar)
- 1 pound of sugar
- 1 pound of salt
- 1 work table

These demonstrations are given to show the latest methods in canning fruits and vegetables.

Mr. Rowe issued a statement Saturday asking that others get in touch with him at once to arrange for other demonstrations. Two will be held in one day, one in the morning and one in the afternoon so as to interfere as little as possible with the regular duties of the housewife.

This is a chance for women of the county to take advantage of expert advice from the state university in canning and packing, said Mr. Rowe, and he believes that a large number of women will attend the demonstrations.

The county agent has requested others who want to arrange for neighborhood demonstrations to act at once in order that arrangements
