My mother is buried in this plot. Her name is on one side of the headstone and my father's name is on the other side.

My father drowned while working for the Savannah River Lumber Company and his body was never found, along with another man whose body also was not recovered. At the time they owned the Milbury Plantation near Allendale. They were transporting heavy equipment on a barge and a third man started the engine which he was not supposed to do. The third man swam to shore. The equipment tipped over and they believe fell on my father and the second man.

Dear Farrow,

I hope that you are doing well. I've been researching your family and wanted to check in with an update.

On my last trip to Columbia, I located your father's death certificate. Unfortunately, it appears to have been filled out by someone at the logging camp who didn't know him very well. Most spaces simply have "Don't know" written in them. It does give the date and briefly describes his boat capsizing. I'm sorry that it did not have more information. (I would email it, but it is a bit hard to read. I doubt you could make much of it out after it had been scanned and reprinted. You can read the hard copy that I will mail you though.)

I located your parents in the Abbeville County Marriage Register. They were married on 19 June 1926. He was 37 and she was 23. He was certainly old enough to have been married before but I did not find an earlier marriage record. The county only started keeping marriage records in 1919 and the marriage likely pre-dated that.

I also located death certificates for your maternal grandparents, William Lucius B. Brunson and Annie Belle Bassett. These did have lots of information and verified their parents' names. Starting with the certificates, I've been working on your mother's family as a good bit of information on them was available. Attached is a rough draft outline of what the line looks like at this point. As I begin to document the line, it will be verified and more detail added. I have quite a list of things to look at on my next trip to the SC State Archives in Columbia. There are several interesting family names. I have a feeling that Googe and Creech can be taken back quite a few generations.

I've found two men who fought for the Confederacy in the Civil War. They are marked on the tree. Would their service records interest you?


On that topic, while I am working on this, were there any genealogical organizations that you were interested in joining? If so, I can watch out for appropriate ancestors.

Of course I am working on your father's line too, but initially the most documentation turned up for your mother's line.

I should get to Columbia for a research day soon, although I'm not sure I can make it up there before the holidays. After my next trip, I will have a packet of information to send you.

Don't forget the tree is just a draft of how things look at this point. I look forward to hearing from you. Thank you so much. Renee

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL MEN SELECTED FOR MILITARY SERVICE AND ORDERED TO REPORT TO A LOCAL BOARD FOR MILITARY DUTY.

The day and hour specified on the Classification List of this Local Board, and on the order and notice of induction into military service which accompanies this notice for you to report to this Local Board for military duty is the time that marks your actual obligation as a soldier of the United States.

Failure to report promptly at the hour and on the day named is a grave military offense for which you may be court-martialed. Willful failure to report with an intent to evade military service constitutes desertion from the Army of the United States, which, in time of war, is a capital offense.

Upon reporting to your Local Board, you will not need, and you should not bring with you, anything except hand baggage. You will not be permitted to take trunks or boxes with you on the train. You should take only the following articles: A pair of strong comfortable shoes to relieve your feet from your new regulation marching shoes; not to exceed four extra suits of underclothing; not to exceed six extra pairs of socks; four face and two bath towels; a comb, a brush, a toothbrush, soap, tooth powder, razor, and shaving soap. It will add to your comfort to bring one woolen blanket, preferably of dark or neutral color. This blanket should be tightly rolled, the ends of the roll should be securely bound together and the loop of the blanket thus formed slung from your left shoulder to your right hip.

You should wear rough strong clothing and a flannel shirt, preferably an olive-drab shirt of the kind issued to soldiers.

NOTE.—Local Boards may have prepared, in the form of a rubber stamp, and stamp in below or on the back hereof any special instructions such as a direction request permission to eat and spend the last night at home, as it may desire to give.



Research was commenced with the review and input of prior research compiled by members of Farrow J. Notes: Smith's family, notably Farrow J. Smith, Sam Smith and Dilbert Alan Smith. This information arrived in the form of handwritten ancestral trees and a formal genealogy report (the latter compiled by Sam Smith), accompanied by notes and further information from Farrow J. Smith.

Authorization: Research to be conducted in 10 hour increments, with updates provided to client at the end of each 10 hour increment.

Summary of Findings:

Documentation of Smith family lines: A.

a. Research for Farrow and Powell Smith has still been inconclusive for 1910, although queries are out to Hampton, Jasper and Colleton County halls of records.

Researching farther back:

- Parentage of Farrow J. Smith: Not only have Farrow's parents and grandparents been found, but also complete family groups and new geographic locations.
 - i. It has already been corroborated that Farrow's mother's name was Mary, via a census found for 1900 in Coosawhatchie, SC. Working on the assumption that the names provided to me by the Smith family are accurate, I expanded my search and met success with both his father and his grandparents:
 - Samuel and Mary Smith were found in St. Peter's Parish, Beaufort, SC in the 1870 US Census. This is prior to the births of Powell, Farrow and the other siblings already documented, however, one child, born 1869, named Nathan, is listed. Nathan has not yet been found on other census reports, but we are still looking for Samuel in 1880. It is also possible that Nathan did not survive his childhood, an unfortunately common experience at the time. The birth years for Samuel and Mary lead me to be reasonably positive that this is the right pair, and that is reinforced by the family groups found immediately next to them on the 1870 census and then on prior census reports, as follows:
 - 1870 US Federal Census for St. Peter's Parish, Beaufort County, SC:
 - Harriet does not appear on the census so it may be assumed that she has passed on by this time. James is listed as being 50 years old, which would change his birthdate yet again to 1820, but the children listed with him reflect that it is the correct family group (Milton and Rufus, now aged 18 and

- 16 respectively).
- ii. James is no longer working as a planter, but is listed as a farmer, with real estate valued at 300 and a personal estate valued at 200. This is a marked difference from his listings on the 1860 census, but it may be as a result of sectioning off his land, as this census shows neighbors of his children, with different dwelling and family numbers (Samuel and his family; James Jr. and his family; and Alex and his family).
- iii. Also listed with James Sr. are Kate Farris aged 16, Meariah Smith, aged 18, Jacob Smith aged 3, and James Smith aged 1 (this could be "Jane" the individual is given as female).
- iv. Other surnames listed on this page are: Ellis, Cleland, Grimes, Mew and Stanley.
- v. NOTE: The difference in the value of James R.'s estates could also be a result of the Civil War...this is being looked into further.

2. Moving farther back:

- a. 1860 US Federal Census for St. Peter's Parish, Beaufort County, SC:
 - James and Harriet were 54 and 45 respectively, giving estimated birth years of: 1806 and 1815. James was still working as a planter. His real estate was valued at 3,500 and his personal estate at 15,000.
 - ii. Living with James and Harriet were: Samuel, aged 30; Mary L., aged 20 (Mary may be Samuel's wife or his sister, but there is a 4 year discrepancy in her age if it is his sister); Charles C., aged 18; Sarah, aged 15 (who could have been listed as Mary on the 1850 Census); Alex, aged 13; Milton aged 8; and Rufus, aged 6.
 - iii. Also found on this page (the first line following the family for James R. Smith) is a James H. Smith, who may be related, aged 23, who had a personal estate valued at 1,000. Charles, Sarah and Alex were all attending school at the time of the census.
 - iv. All individuals were born in South Carolina.
 - v. The issues with the individuals named Mary L. and Sarah may be a result of trying to separate Samuel's wife from his sister. This will be researched further.
 - vi. Other surnames found on this census page are: McDonald; Dewitt, Tindol, Breland, Cleland and Grimes.

- b. 1850 US Federal Census for St. Peter's Parish, Beaufort County, SC:
 - James and Harriett were aged 40 and 36 respectively, allowing an estimate for birth years of 1810 and 1814 respectively. James was working as a planter, and the value of his real estate was entered at 1,000.
 - ii. Also living in this household were: Sammy, aged 15; Charles, aged 13; Alexander, aged 8; Mary, aged 6; and Milton, aged 2. Per the census, all individuals in this family group were born in South Carolina.
 - iii. Additionally, Sammy, the eldest, is shown to have been working as a laborer.
 - iv. No other Smiths are reflected on this census page, but other surnames (for possible research later on) are: Wallace, Nichols, Sarlique, Landon, Fitts, Kittles and Blakewood.
- b. <u>Geography of the Smith Family</u>: Prior research clearly reflects the Smith family setting down roots in the Coosawhatchie area. The difficulty encountered was the lack of these names appearing prior to 1900. This segment of research brings us to St. Peter's Parish, Beaufort, SC.
 - i. Additional Notes Regarding Beaufort, SC and St. Peter's Parish:
 - First discovered by the Spanish in 1514 and chartered by the British in 1711, Beaufort is the second-oldest town in South Carolina. The area experienced great prosperity in the eighteenth century when indigo and rice plantations thrived. Prior to the Civil War, Sea Island Cotton also brought great wealth to Beaufort residents.

 - 2. In 1706 Parishes were set up within the bounds of the existing Counties. Neither the Counties nor the Parishes were divisions of the other, they just coexisted, with the Parish actually having the record keeping authority. The original Parishes of 1706 were Saint John's, Saint James Goose Creek, Saint Thomas, Saint Denis, Christ Church, Saint Philip's, Saint Andrew's, Saint James Santee, Saint Bartholomew's and Saint Paul's. In 1712 Saint Helena's Parish was created from part of St. Bartholomew's Parish. In 1717 Saint George's Parish was created from part of St. Andrew's. In 1721 Prince George Parish was created from St. James Santee Parish. In 1734 Prince Frederick Parish was created from Prince George Parish. Also in 1734 Saint John's Colleton Parish was created from St. Paul's Parish. In 1745 Prince William Parish was created from St. Helena's Parish. In 1747 Saint Peter's Parish was created from Prince William Parish. In 1751 Saint Michael's Parish was created from St. Philip's Parish. In 1754 Saint Stephen's Parish was created from St. James Santee Parish. In 1757 Saint Mark's Parish was created from Prince Frederick Parish. In 1767 All Saint's Parish was created from Prince George Parish. Also Saint Luke's Parish was created from Saint Peter's Parish. In 1768 Saint David's Parish was created from Saint Mark's Parish. Also Saint Matthew's Parish was created from St. George's Parish and St. James Santee Parish. 2) Documentation for the parentage and further ancestry of this generation has now been discovered and opens further lines for research queries and additional corroboration.

Recommendation for Continuation of Research:

I will continue forward with my efforts to document the lines from most recent to least through national and local sources, including but not limited to:

- A. Queries have been started with local counties regarding county lines during the 1800s and resultant locations for records. Further historical research has shown that Jasper County had a fire at some point in its history and as a result many records may have been lost irretrievably. Once I have received answers from these local records houses on my initial queries I will have the information I need to begin a personal review of local documentation.
- B. Further corroboration and documentation on the families of James R. Smith and Harriet, as well as Samuel and Mary, is being conducted, to include military, land, migration and probate records. Older census reports are being searched as well, but the additional documentation if available is necessary as census reports from 1840 and farther back do not itemize the full family group, listing instead only heads of house.
- C. As always, please share this with your family—sometimes the oddest of facts may jog a memory of a family story and those memories are always valuable.

Notes: Research was commenced with the review and input of prior research compiled by members of Farrow J. Smith's family, notably Farrow J. Smith, Sam Smith and Dilbert Alan Smith. This information arrived in the form of handwritten ancestral trees and a formal genealogy report (the latter compiled by Sam Smith), accompanied by notes and further information from Farrow J. Smith.

Authorization: Research to be conducted in 10 hour increments, with updates provided to client at the end of each 10 hour increment.

Summary of Findings:

- A. Documentation of most recent lines:
- a. Farrow J. Smith (Senior) was researched first via on-line resources including (but not limited to: census reports, voter lists, land documentation, and military records.) Farrow (found more frequently as "Forrow") was found on census reports in South Carolina for the years 1930 and 1900. See attached genealogy reports for more details, however, we are still searching for him in 1910 and 1920. His military enlistment date is 1918, so he may not have appeared on the 1920 census if he was in service at the time.
- b. Powell Smith has also been found on the 1900, 1920 and 1930 census reports, however he too has not yet been discovered on a 1920 census. See attached genealogy report for more detailed information.
- c. Mary Smith, the mother of Farrow, Powell and their siblings, has been found in 1900. At this time she was already widowed, and had 4 of her 7 children living with her at home (Powell, Farrow (spelled Forrow), Harriett and Eva). She is shown to be 51 years of age and to have given birth to 7 children, all of whom were living in 1900. All people represented on this census for this family group are shown to have been born in South Carolina, as are their parents.
 - B. Researching farther back:
- a. Parentage of Farrow J. Smith: The only documentation at this time on the parentage of Farrow Smith is that given on the 1900 census. This does not, however, provide documentation of the name given for his father of "Samuel Josiah Smith" and at this time it should be noted that no individuals of that name have yet been discovered. We are still early in the research phases, however, and time may yet clear this issue.

b. Geography of the Smith Family: county lines in South Carolina in the late 1700s and early 1800s is fluid at best. Both the townships of Grays and Gillisonville are currently considered to be in Jasper County, however, these townships were earlier considered parts of both Hampton and Beaufort counties at earlier dates. As a result, finding documentation is made more complex as we work to uncover when each town was a part of which county, and where the local records therefor are currently held. Calls and trips to those county chambers of commerce may be required to further some of this research. As these seats are within an hour of my location, this research is easily done.

Itemized Research Findings:

- Documentation for Farrow and Powell still to be done to fill in holes choronologically (see above regarding missing census records).
- 2) Documentation for the parentage and further ancestry of this generation has yet to be uncovered, but it is early yet.
- 3) Questions for Farrow:
 - a) I note on some of Farrow (Senior's) personal papers, provided by you, that he had a tendency to give his legal name as F.J. Smith. Is this particular to that Farrow or something that has been a part of family tradition?
 - b) The names provided in both Dilbert Alan Smith's and Sam Smith's genealogy reports regarding the parentage of Farrow are not yet proving out, his report was not accompanied by any documentation how certain is the family of these names (specifically referring to Samuel Josiah Smith and Mary Elaine Phillips). Any further notes or remembrances on this, including nicknames, would be most helpful. Particularly since their father had died before 1900, and this generation is born between census years.
 - c) Is there any connection to Virginia or Tennessee in your recollection? There is a Farrow Smith from that region as well, and the name is unique enough for me to take notice of it recurring elsewhere.

Recommendation for Continuation of Research:

I will continue forward with my efforts to document the lines from most recent to least through national and local sources, including but not limited to:

- A. Contacting the county seats in Jasper, Hampton and Beaufort Counties to gather more information regarding the townships of Grays and Gillisonville, and hopefully ascertain where local records may be kept for perusal. Once we have that nailed down I would like to travel to those locations, all of which are local to me, to examine any such documentation that might be available. Any further information regarding corroboration of Farrow's parents would of course be helpful.
- B. Conducting page by page perusals of the state and federal census reports of likely townships for the residence of family members in the late 1800s and missing years of the early 1900s. Global searches involving the more obvious spellings of given and surnames have resulted in missing years, which leads the researcher to a more painstaking search. Thankfully, we have found the US Census reports for enough time periods to allow for reasonable assumptions to be made regarding the geographic location of the family during the missing census years, which will hopefully yield more information regarding the given name for Farrow's father.
