INTRODUCTION

The James Thompson family which originated in Holden, in what is now Worcester County, Massachusetts, and only a few miles north of the city of Worcester, was but one of many families of that name in Massachusetts, most of whom appear not to have been related.

From all accounts it may be assumed that James Thompson was one of 319 so-called Scotch-Irish pioneers who, in 1718, signed a petition to Governor Shute of Massachusetts, asking permission to settle therein. Subsequently, in August of that year, five ships carrying many of those pioneers landed in Boston. James Thompson undoubtedly was a passenger on one of those ships, at which time he must have been about 47 years of age.

His wife Jannet, whose family name has not been found, undoubtedly accompanied them, as she probably is about twice as old as their children, Samuel, Ruth and Jannet, being in age, it would appear, from about 10 years to about 8 years. The family probably came from Ulster, Ireland, where other children may have been born, of whom no record has been found.

Those Scotch-Irish immigrants spent the winter of 1718 - 1719 in Andover, Haverhill and vicinity. In April 1719, some of them settled Londonderry and Derry, in what is now New Hampshire and another group settled in Worcester and established Rutland in 1722. In 1738, some of the latter group established Pelham, in what is now Hampshire County.

The earliest known record of the family of James Thompson appears to be in Leicester, about seven miles to the south of Holden, in April 1724, when Samuel, son of James, recorded his intention of marriage to Agnes Work. The marriage record has not been found.

On April 11, 1726, Eleazor Howe and Deacon Caleb Rice, both of Marlboro, in Middlesex County, gave a deed to Samuel Thompson and William Thompson, of Leicester, conveying some 45 acres of land in North Worcester. This land later became a part of northern Holden, bordering on Rutland. On February 18, 1733, Samuel and William Thompson sold to James Thompson 37 1/2 acres of this land. Three months later James Thompson deeded back to Samuel 30 of these acres. On October 10, 1741, Samuel sold 19 acres of his land to Hugh Thompson, who had married his sister Ruth in 1732 in Rutland.

That the Samuel Thompson of Leicester, who purchased land in 1726, sold part of it to James Thompson in 1733 and repurchased most of it three months later, was the son of James, appears certain. But the relationship to James of William, of Leicester and of Hugh, who married James' daughter Ruth, is a matter for speculation.

Hugh Thompson's will, made in 1756, named his wife Ruth and William Thompson of Leicester as Executors, from which fact it has been concluded that Hugh and William probably were brothers and it has been conjectured, as far as I am aware, without refutation, that they were nephews of James of Holden. William and Hugh were approximately the same age as James' son Samuel and they probably came from Ireland at the same time.

In 1932, the Rev. Alven Martyn Smith published a genealogy of James Thompson of Holden, Mass. and his descendants, which clearly was the result of extensive and careful research. His work, nevertheless, left much to be desired with respect to dates and places, as well as information concerning many of the wives and husbands of James Thompson's descendants.

For a number of years I have been making an extensive study of the several Thompson families which originated in the colony of Massachusetts, as a descendant of David Thompson, progenitor of the family which originated in Mendon, in the hope of ultimately publishing a record of the Mendon family, about which I have found very little in print.

In the course of this research I have extracted all of the Thompson data from the published vital records of Massachusetts, have examined all of the earlier Thompson probate records in several countries of the state and have accumulated considerable information from many other sources. Much of the data thus assembled concerns members of the family of James Thompson, of Holden, some of which is not to be found in the Reverend Smith's work. Even this additional information, however, leaves much to be desired for a complete record of the Holden family.

My efforts have been confined to the earlier generations of all of the Thompson families and exclusively to descendants by the name of Thompson. Also, they have been confined for the most part to members of the several families residing in Massachusetts.

On the following pages will be set forth all the data that is currently available to me with respect to the first five generations of descendants of James Thompson of Holden bearing the Thompson name, including also the descendants of Hugh Thompson, son-in-law of James. I trust that it may prove helpful to others who may be interested in members of this family.

The following letter was sent to me by Linda Clark who lives in California, she received it from a relative and this is how I found out that there was a printed genealogy on our family. I was introduced to her by Linda Miganowicz. I couldn't wait to call her. She sent me her family tree and now I am in the process of sending this to her.

Last Sunday Jerry and I went on a tour of the Mormon Temple Grounds. Among other things, the guide told us that the Mormons marry for all eternity, while other religions marry only until death do them part. Further, Mormons look up their ancestors and go through a ritual which marries the ancestor for all eternity. Hence, the departed spirit no longer wanders in loneliness about the spirit world. In connection with this practice, the Mormons have one of the best genealogical libraries in the world. Having nothing to do while Jerry is away all day, I wandered up on Monday to see what I could find out. Whatever else may be true of the Mormons, they are the most helpful people I have ever met. The girl in charge showed me how to use the library, although signs everywhere say it is for the use of the society only.

I looked for both Thompson and Wheeler - I am not sure about the Wheeler information, but the Thompson stuff is right, I am sure.

Back during the reign of Queen Elizabeth (the time of Shakespeare) our ancestors were probably living in the lowlands of Scotland. At the time the Irish were kicking up a fuss as usual. Finally after two Earls, with the help of the Spanish, had tried to overthrow the British Crown. The British ruler confiscated their lands, and made them available to settlers. The Scots from the lowlands moved into what comes to be called Ulster and Londonberry.

Under the leadership of seven evangelists, preaching the Presbyterian faith, these immigrants to Ulster became so skillful and thrifty, that their products offered severe competition to their English neighbor. English laws made importation of these Scotch-Irish goods illegal in Britain and in the American Colony.

After the revolution of 1808, another tide of emigration swept Scotland. But economic conditions in the early 18th century were so bad - there was a succession of bad crops, laws prohibited the exportation of many of their products, and absentee English Landlords raised their rents - that the lot of these Scotch-Irish became unbearable. Their only escape was New England. Accordingly, in 1718, a committee was sent to Gov. Shute of Mass. to settle in that state.

Five shiploads, carrying from 600 to 800 passengers, landed in Boston in August 1718. These people introduced the spinning wheel and the potato to New England.

The James Thompson who was our ancestor either went directly to Worcester with the rest of the "Worcester Colony" and spent the first winter there, or came very soon after, for his name appears on the record of Worcester April 11, 1726.

The people of Worcester were very intolerable of these "Irish" and there were queer ways, and especially of winter was a difficult one and when spring came these settlers spread out into the extremities of Worcester which later formed the townships of Holden, Rutland, and Leicester.

James Thompson settled on a 3/1/2 farm in Holden, bounded by on the north by the Rutland town line. James bought the land from Samuel and William Thompson, who in turn bought the land from Caleb Rice, one of the founders of Worcester. Shortly afterward, James deeded the land back to his son Samuel. And there is no record of him holding any land for any length of time. In a Holden town meeting of 24 May 1743, it was voted that Samuel Thompson be the person to procure an acre of land as a burying ground for the town. This is situated in the center of town on the opposite side of the road to the common. In this cemetery the old slate tombstones lie in two rows. James and his wife Jannet, Samuel and his w

life Margaret and children John, Ann, Capt. Samuel with his sons Benjamin and Calvin; also Hugh and his wife Ruth (all the children with the exception of Capt. Samuel - that is John, Ann, Benjamin, and Calvin died before they reached their majority. I do not know where the others are buried).

The name Thompson means " judgment, power," and is first found in 1598. It is derived from the name Thomas. Tom has been in vogue for centuries, then came Tom's son. The Scandinavian spelled the name Tomsen and later Tomson. The Scotch put in the "h" and the Irish put in the "p" and we have Thompson.

I vaguely remember mother telling saying that Mrs. Houghton had traced her genealogy back to the time of the revolution. She descends from this James Thompson, but in the third generation, while we are of Capt. Samuel strain, she descends from his brother Thomas. C. F. Thompson and Louise descend from the same brother Thomas.

The most illustrious members of the family descends from the son of Capt. Samuel's brother Thomas. The son's name was Daniel - born 1794 - and married a Sally Putnam who's ancestors came over on the Mayflower, and who descended from royalty in England. I checked to see if our lines crossed again, but they do not. The compiler of the genealogy was descended from the Daniel and Sally line. His name was Benjamin Franklin Thompson and he lived in Cleveland, Ohio. His son still lives there. I'm going to look him up when I go there again.

Naturally the compiler spent the most of his time on his own line, and, after Capt. Samuel, he has not much to say about our line. It may be that there isn't much to say or that he was busy.

Other lines of the family produced explorers - a Thompson was on the first expedition to the Oregon territory; engineer - a Thompson was an engineer on one of the railroad lines through the Rocky Mountains. There were many scholars, clergymen, and leaders of their community. Two were feeble-minded - out of over thirteen hundred - a few had apoplexy, a few had consumption, but the biggest trend was the one to have more than one wife. That is probably because in those early, unscientific times, the wife died after the first six or eight children. But the husband didn't suffer so he remarried and had six or eight more. The record is four wives I think, held by Capt. Samuel's son Joseph, and 21 children all by one wife, but I don't remember who holds that record.

It doesn't say anywhere that Dad's father, John Charles was in the Civil War, but he was old enough to fight at the time of the Civil War was being fought. Do you know anything about him, Dad?

The James Thompson that came from Ulster was married to a woman called Jeanette. The compiler of the genealogy thought that she might be a Huguenot - as many of them emigrated to Scotland, and Jeanette is not a Scotch name.

I am enclosing a sketch of our family tree - I didn't carry it out on any of the other branches but ours, but the information is in the book if any one would like to find it. The book is called James Thompson of Holden, Mass. and his Descendants by Alven Martyn Smith and Benjamin Franklin Thompson; published and copyrighted by Alven M. Smith. I am going to buy a copy if the book is not out of print.

I certainly got the surprise of my life when I found out we could trace such a direct line way back before the Revolution; and we had a commissioned officer fighting for our independence. He must of been a smart man to hold a commission then, because it wasn't easy.

Upon reading this letter my research became intensified. I had already studied The History of Hubbardston, Vol. 1, The History of Holden, The Vital Records of all local towns, visited almost every cemetery in Holden, Hubbardston, Grafton, and Bolton, gone to all the local town halls and spoke to all the town clerks and members of the cemetery commission. But now I found out that there was a printed genealogy on our family and I had to find it. A visit to the State Archives in Boston turned up more dates and names but still no book. It wasn't un

til I went to the Genealogical Library at the Hartford, Conn. State Building that I struck GOLD. Not only did I find a printed genealogy of the Thompson family but I found one on the Waite family, Felton family, and Hodges family. There was also one printed of the Clark family and the Hathaway family but I didn't have a chance to see if they pertained to our families. I am planning a trip back there as soon as the weather gets nicer. And know I will precede with my findings.

FIRST GENERATION

James (1) Thompson - born probably Ulster, Ireland, about 1671; died Holden, Mass. 18 August 1755, in his 84th year. married Jennet (Jannet, Jeanette) (ancestry unknown) probably in Ireland before 1699. She was born about 1667 and died 28 April 1744 in Holden, Mass. ae. about 77 years of age. There is some speculation that she may have been a Huguenot originally from Scotland because of her uncommon first name. They came to New England 1718 with at least three children. There is no evidence to prove it but they may have left some grown children behind when they left Ireland. The oldest to come over with them was around 18 at the time. We know they had at least three children, all probably born in Ireland.

In 1733 James, "associated with 16 others, petitioned the proprietors, praying that the land might be taxed to defray the expense which would arise from building a meeting house and supporting a minister. This attempt was not successful, but Thompson and his fellow townsmen did not relax their efforts. The right of petition, the most reasonable of all rights, which they continued to exercise until their desires were fully gratified in the year 1736 by a vote from the proprietors to erect a house for public worship." (p. 13, Estes) Both James and Jennet are buried in the Old Burying Ground in Holden, Mass.

Their three children are Samuel, Ruth, and James.

Samuel (2) was born about 1699; died 1756 in Holden, Mass.
married (1) Agnes Work (1 child);
(2) Margaret Clark (9 children).

Ruth (2) was born about 1703; died 14 September 1770 in Holden, Mass

married Hugh Thompson (ancestry unknown probably nephew to James and Jennet, who came over from Ireland at the same time.) He was probably in Ireland, about 1699. He died 3 September 1756 in Holden, Mass. He was about 57 years old. They were married on 2 March 1732 in Rutland, Mass. They are both buried in the Old Burying Ground Cemetery in Holden, Mass. They had 5 children.

Hannah - born probably about 1733, died before 1814, unmarried

ere published November 1779 in Brookfield, Mass. She was born
about 1733; died 21 May 1800 in Bethel, Vermont. They
had no children.

SECOND GENERATION

Samuel (2) Thompson - (James 1) - Born probably about 1699 in Ireland; died 14 August 1756 in Holden, Mass. ae. 57 years. Married (1) Agnes Work (ancestry unknown) (intentions were published 19 April 1724 in Leicester, Mass.). She died before 1727. They had one child together.

married (2) Margaret Clark (ancestry unknown) on 27 February 1727 in Westborough, Mass. She was born about 1707 and died 21 July 1788 in Holden, Mass. ae.. 82 years. They are buried together in the Old Burying Ground Cemetery in Holden, Mass., along with three of their children. They had 9 children together, all probably born in Holden.

Samuel had been in Holden prior to its township. In 1741 he was on the committee to provide a schoolmaster for the town. In 1743 it was " Voted , that Mr. Samuel Thompson be the person to procure an acre of land on ye South west side of ye highway tordes Rutland taking ye land on which we have burie d on as a bureing place for ye Town." (p. 341, Estes). In 1742 he serve d as a selectman and again in 1754. In 1744 he was he was the Town Treasu rer.

Child With First Wife:

James (3) - born probably 1725 / 26 in Holden, Mass.; died 31 December 1795 in Princeton, Mass.; married Margaret Cowden (ancestry unknown) on 10 April 1751 in Holden. They had 5 children all born in Rutland, Mass.

Agnes (4) - born 22 February 1752; no record of death; married William Gilchrest (ancestry unknown) on 8 September 1772 in New Braintree, Mass. Nothing else is known.

Mary (4) - born 16 May 1755; died 22 April 1832 in Royalston, Ma ss. ae. 78 years unmarried.

Elizabeth (4) - born 13 August 1757; no further information.

Hannah (4) - baptized 7 October 1759; no record of death; marrie d David Nichols (ancestry unknown) on 17 May 1787 in Roy alston, Mass. Nothing else is known.

Nathan (4) - baptized 10 October 1762 in Rutland; died date unkn own in Rochester or Buffalo, New York; married Mary Cutler (dau ghter of Jonathan and Elisabeth [Holman]) on 22 November 1781 in Royalston. She was born 28 December 1758 in Sutton, Mass .; no record of death. They had at least one child.

Children With Second Wife:

William (3) - born about 1728 probably in Holden; died 7 September 1811 in Princeton, Mass. ae. 83 years.; married Ann Thompson (da ughter of William and Sarah) on 23 June 1757 in Leicester, Mass . She was born about 1726 in Leicester and died 11 June 1811 i n Princeton, Mass. ae. 85. They had 5 children tog ether.

Samuel (4) - born 28 April 1758 in Holden; died after 18 11 in Marlboro, New Hampshire; married Polly (or Molly) Beth (daughter of Andrew) on 22 August 1782 in Hubbardston, Mass. Nothing else is known. They had 5 children all born in Marlboro, New Hampshire.

Mary (4) - born 3 May 1760; died after 1811; married Jam es Stewart of Montague, Mass. (ancestry unknown) o n 3 May 1780 Nothing else is known.

James (4) - born 4 October 1762; nothing else is known

William (4) - born 13 August 1765 in Princeton; died 12 July 1800 in Princeton ae. 35 years; married Margaret Thompson (daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth [Frye]) (intentions were published 9 April 1792 in Princeton). She was born 8 September 1770 in Royalston, Mass. and died 21 June 1859. They had 4 children, all born in Princeton. She remarried a Thomas Boyce of Rutland.

John (4) - born 9 February 1786 in Princeton; died 16 January 1831 in Guilford, New York; married Lydia Stone (daughter of John and Martha [Craft]) on 30 May 1793 in Newton, Mass. Intentions were published on 7 April 1793 in Watertown, Mass. She was born on 20 April 1771 in Newton, Mass. and died 20 January 1801 in Guilford, New York. They had 8 children, all born in Princeton, Mass.

Ann (3) - born about 1730 in Holden and died 29 September 1742 ae. 12 years. She is buried in the Old Burying Ground Cemetery in Holden with her parents and two brothers.

John (3) - born about 1732 in Holden and died 17 September 1742 in Holden, Mass. He died 12 days before his sister. He is buried in the Old Burying Ground Cemetery in Holden, Mass.

Samuel (3) - born about 1734 in Holden, Mass.; died 3 January 1787 in Holden ae. 52 years; married Azubah Stevens (daughter of Isaac and Mercy [Hubbard]) on 7 October 1762 in Holden. She was born probably in Rutland, Mass. There is no record of death. They had 11 children together. She remarried a Henry Taft on 5 May 1791 in Holden.

Esther (3) - born about 1736; died about 1830; married Thomas Pickings of Middleborough, Mass. (ancestry unknown) on 17 January 1764 in Holden. He died before 1820. Nothing else is known.

Isaac (3) - born about 1739; died 16 February 1833 in Princeton, Mass. ae. 93 He was unmarried.

Thomas (3) - born about 1742 in Holden; died 20 February 1813 in Keene, New Hampshire ae. 71 years; married (1) Elizabeth Frye (daughter of John and Elizabeth) on 29 March 1769 in Royalston. She was born 12 July 1751 in Royalston and died 19 March 1780. ae. 28 years. They had 5 children all born in Royalston.

married (2) Sarah Scott (daughter of Benjamin and Azubah [Cheney]) on 3 October 1782 in Fitzwilliam, New Hampshire. She was born 9 October 1758 in Sturbridge, Mass. and died 21 April 1840 in Keene, New Hampshire. ae. 81 years. They had 8 children together. The first three were born in Middleborough, New Hampshire and the others were born in Keene, New Hampshire.

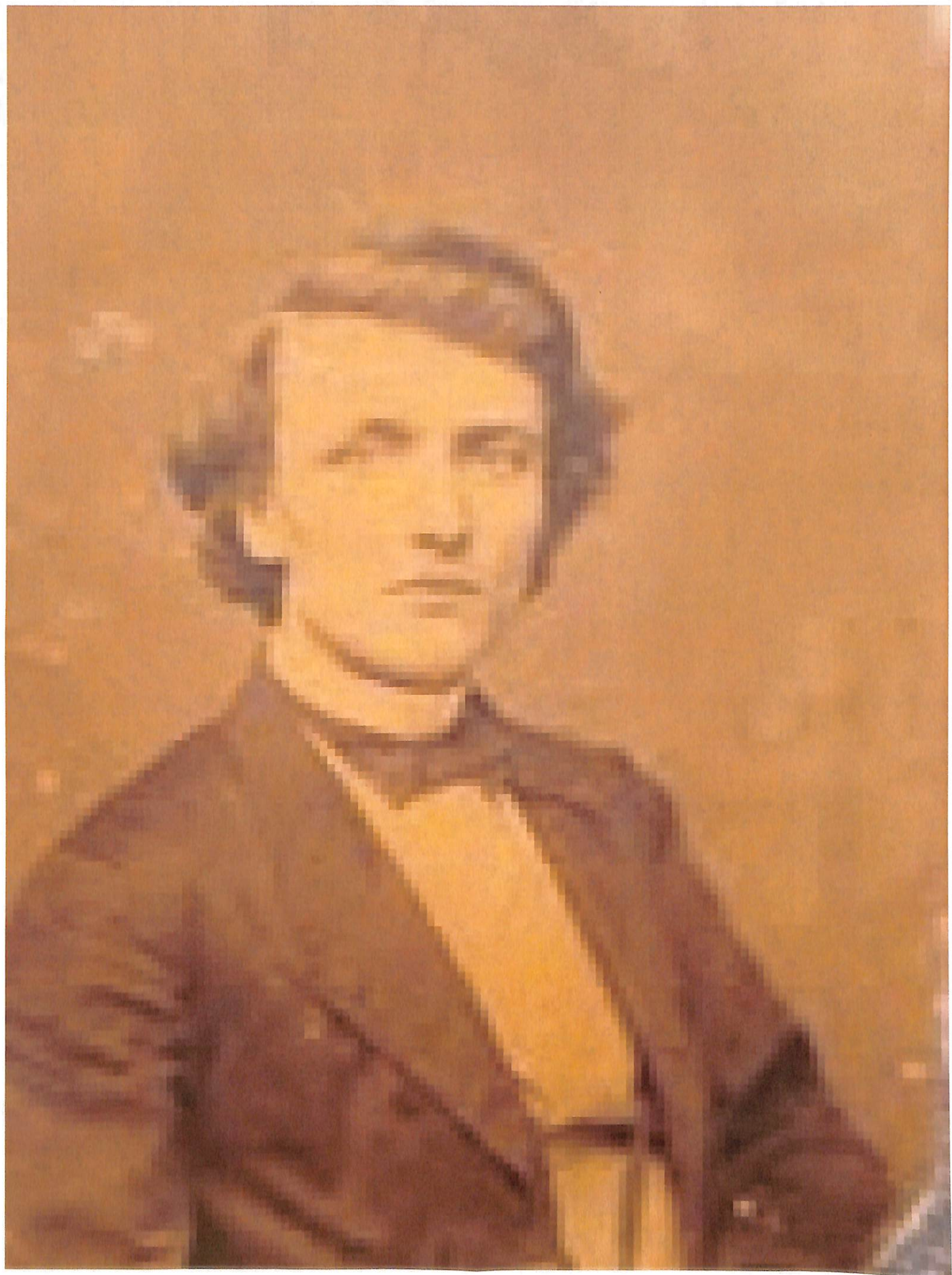

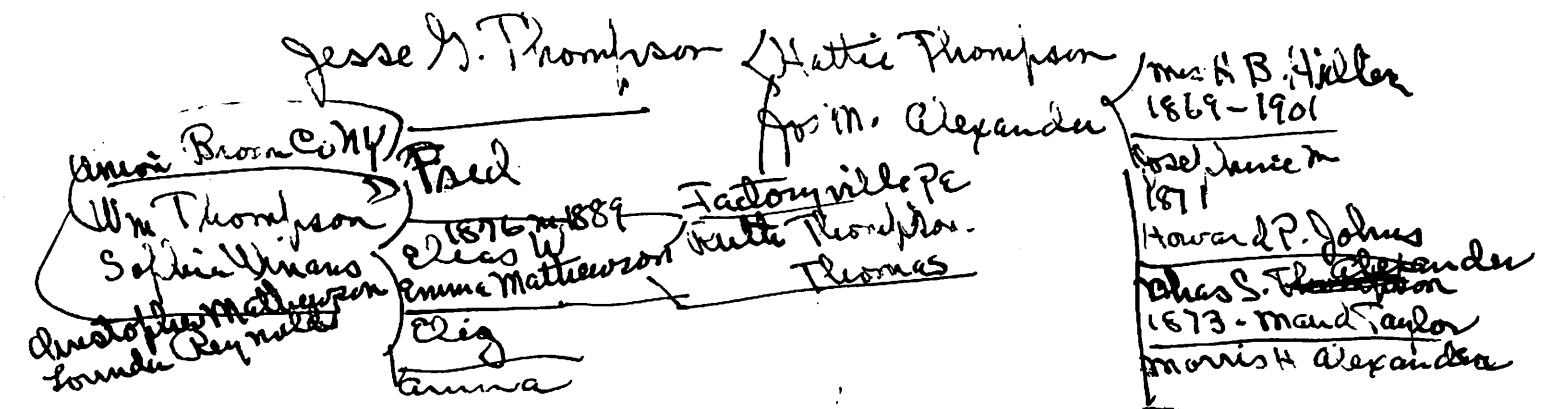
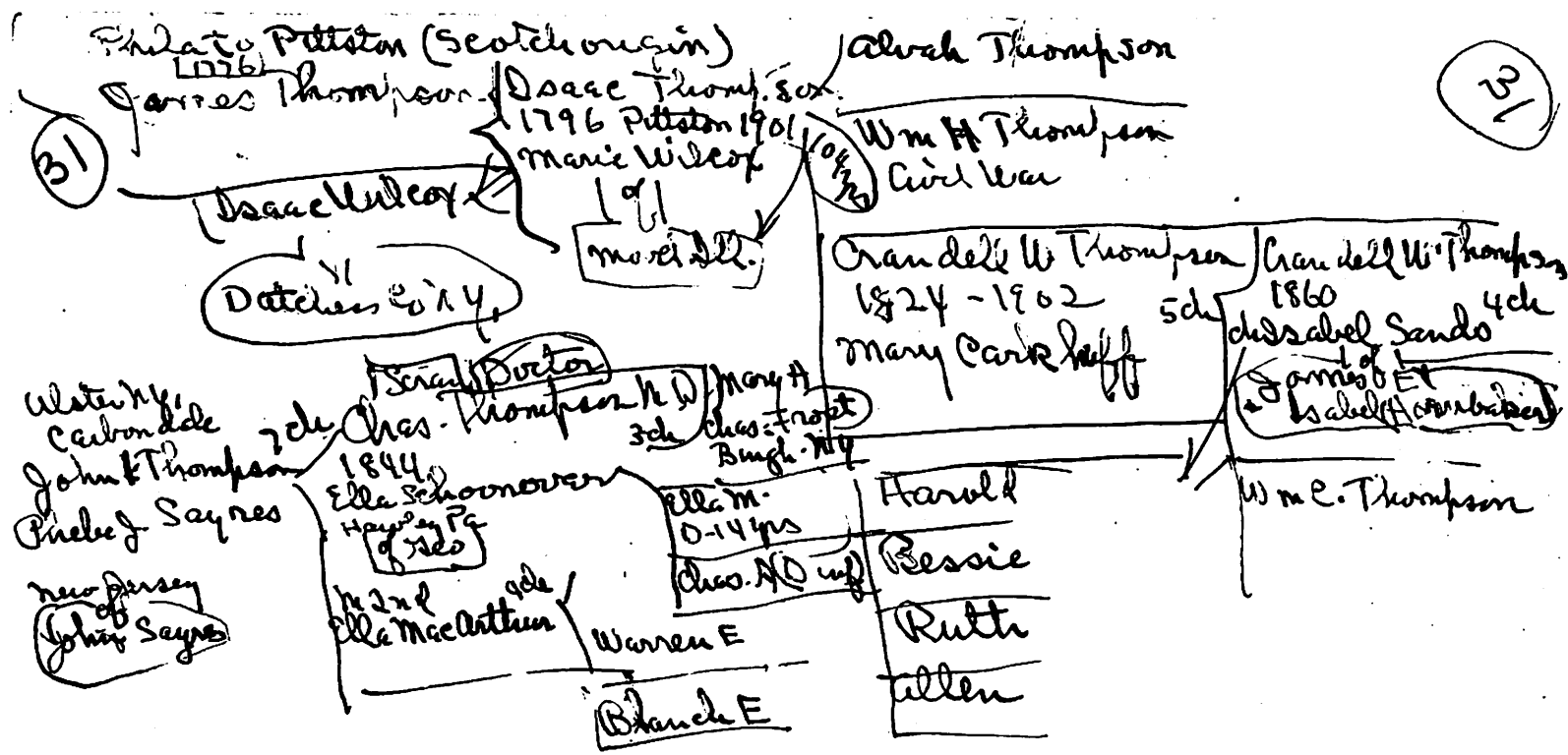
